<sup>(</sup>b) the passage of motions or amendments introduced by individual Members requires a majority vote of each of the two groups of Members present:

<sup>-</sup> Members returned by the Election Committee; and

<sup>-</sup> Members returned by functional constituencies and by geographical constituencies through direct elections.
