As of 2024, Hong Kong has a total of over 130 declared monuments and 1 200-odd graded historic buildings, and it is believed that such numbers will certainly increase as time passes; as regards preservation of existing monuments and historic buildings, one approach is to revitalize them, so as to promote co-existence of conservation and development.

Given that heritage conservation is a global trend, this Council urges the Government to examine the relevant existing policies with a view to enhancing the development of heritage tourism and stimulating the growth of tourism industry at large.
