Dear President,

Further to the Chief Executive (CE)'s letter dated 21 May to you, in which he expressed his grave concern over the recurrence of unruly behaviour of and the use of abusive language by some Members at Legislative Council (LegCo) meetings, on behalf of the HKSAR Government, I am writing to strongly reprimand Hon WONG Yuk-man, Hon LEUNG Kwok-hung, Hon Albert CHAN Wai-yip and Hon CHAN Chi-chuen for yelling and throwing objects with a view to disrupting order at the CE's Question and Answer Session (Q&A Session) last Thursday.

Although I have written to you on the disorderly behaviour of the above Members on behalf of the HKSAR Government on a number of occasions and have expressed our concern in public, and that your good self has repeatedly warned the Members concerned and ordered them to withdraw from meetings, they have not shown any improvement. Instead, they have further aggravated their unruly behaviour which eventually resulted in the termination of last week's Q&A Session. The HKSAR Government is of the view that the behaviour of these Members

would not only severely impede the functioning of LegCo, but also damage the relationship between the Executive and the Legislature and undermine the image of Hong Kong internationally. Obviously, this has failed to live up to public's expectations of LegCo.

As pointed out by the CE after the Q&A Session, the HKSAR Government considers that LegCo should follow up seriously on the behaviour of the Members concerned. It should also take action to restore the normal operation of LegCo and to preserve the dignity which the Legislature and government officials deserve. I earnestly hope that LegCo could deal with the situation promptly and effectively, with a view to preventing the recurrence of similar incidents in future.
