- Notes: (1) According to the Judgment of the Court of First Instance of the High Court ("CFI") on 15 November 2016, Sixtus LEUNG Chung-hang and YAU Wai-ching had been disqualified from assuming the office of a Member of the Legislative Council ("LegCo"), and had vacated the same since 12 October 2016, and were not entitled to act as Members of LegCo.
- (2) According to the Judgment of the CFI on 14 July 2017, LEUNG Kwok-hung, Nathan LAW Kwun-chung, YIU Chung-yim and LAU Siu-lai had been disqualified from assuming the office of a Member of LegCo, and had vacated the same since 12 October 2016, and were not entitled to act as Members of LegCo.
- (3) Gary FAN Kwok-wai, AU Nok-hin, Vincent CHENG Wing-shun and Tony TSE Wai-chuen were declared to be returned as Members of LegCo at the LegCo by-election held on 11 March 2018, and took the oath to assume office at the Council meeting of 21 March 2018.
- (4) CHAN Hoi-yan was declared to be returned as a Member of LegCo at the LegCo by-election held on 25 November 2018, and took the oath to assume office at the Council meeting of 28 November 2018.
- (5) According to the Judgment of the CFI handed down on 2 September 2019 and 13 September 2019 respectively, AU Nok-hin and Gary FAN Kwok-wai were not duly elected as a Member of LegCo at the LegCo by-election held on 11 March 2018 and no other person was duly elected instead. According to the decision of the Court of Final Appeal of 17 December 2019 refusing their applications for leave to appeal and by virtue of section 72(5)(b) of the Legislative Council Ordinance (Cap. 542), they ceased to be Members of LegCo on 17 December 2019.
- (6) Pursuant to section 15(1)(a) of the Legislative Council Ordinance (Cap. 542), HO Kai-ming ceases to hold office as a member of LegCo upon his resignation on 1 June 2020.
