		in the performance of its functions.
		A new ss. (2) is added to stipulate non-delegable power and functions. The new ss. (7) provides for
10	9	the interpretation of the references to "the Commission" in relation to the performance a function when such has been delegated.
		The power of CE to give directions under ss. (1) is restricted to further the Commission 's regulatory
11	11	objectives or the performance of its functions in the public interest. A new ss. (3) is added allowing
		the direction of CE to substitute for the Commission's opinion, being satisfied and duty to consult.
		The new ss. (4) makes it clear that the directions given by CE are not subsidiary legislation.
		The obligation to furnish information is extended in three aspects: (i) to the principles and practices

		state of affairs of the Commission & the results of its operations & cash flow in the financial year.

16	16	A new ss. (8) is added to empower the Director of Audit to authorize public officers to perform any
		function under ss. (7).

s. 1-24, & 26 of Schedule 2 Part I	5	The new <i>s</i> . 6 empowers the chairman to designate an executive director to be the chairman during the inability to act of himself and any deputy chairman. The new <i>s</i> . 7(b) empowers the FS to appoint an executive director as chairman when the deputy chairman is unable to act and there is no designation under <i>s</i> . 6. The new <i>s</i> . 9 deems deputy chairman or an executive director acting as chairman under <i>s</i> . 5 or in accordance with a designation under <i>s</i> . 6 or 7 to be chairman of the Commission. The new <i>s</i> . 12 states expressly that CE shall determine the remuneration etc. payable to a member of the Commission. The new <i>s</i> . 17 permits telephone or video meeting or meeting by other means. New <i>s</i> . 21 to 24 permits a written resolution by the Commission in place of a meeting.
