<u>Bills</u>

First Reading

Securities and Futures Bill Banking (Amendment) Bill 2000

The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Securities and Futures Bill Banking (Amendment) Bill 2000

The Secretary for Financial Services moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council on each of the above two Bills.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debates on the above Bills were adjourned and the Bills were referred to the House Committee.

Members' Motions

<u>Proposed resolutions under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance</u>

Hon Mrs Miriam LAU moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the Resolution of the Legislative Council (L.N. 206 of 2000) (Commencement) Notice 2000, published as Legal Notice No. 286 of 2000 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 25 October 2000, be amended, by repealing "1 December 2000" and substituting "1 December 2001".

Question on the motion proposed.

The Chairman of the Subcommittee formed to study the Resolution of the Legislative Council (L.N. 206 of 2000) (Commencement) Notice 2000 and the Fixed Penalty (Criminal Proceedings) (No. 3) Regulation and the Secretary for the Environment and Food spoke on the motion.

Another six Members spoke on the motion.

The Secretary for the Environment and Food spoke again.

Hon Mrs Miriam LAU replied.

Question on the motion put.

Hon Mrs Miriam LAU claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 28 were present, four were in favour of the motion and 24 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 22 were present, four were in favour of the motion and 17 against it. (Voting record in Appendix I.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

The President stated that Hon Mrs Miriam LAU had indicated that she would withdraw her second proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance if her first motion was negatived. Since this was the case, Hon Mrs Miriam LAU had therefore withdrawn her second proposed resolution. With the permission of the President, Hon Mrs Miriam LAU gave reasons of her withdrawal.

Abolishing the age requirement for dependent parent allowance

Hon WONG Sing-chi moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the serious unemployment situation in Hong Kong has forced many people to retire early, this Council urges the Government to abolish the age requirement that a dependent parent must reach the age of 60 to qualify for the dependent parent allowance, so that all taxpayers with dependent parents are eligible to claim such allowance, thereby providing an incentive for taxpayers to provide for their parents who are under the age of 60 and are unemployed or have no income, so as to alleviate their financial burden.

At 5:53 pm, the President's Deputy took the chair during the temporary absence of the President.

Question on the motion proposed.

10 Members and the Secretary for the Treasury spoke on the motion.

At 7:13 pm, the President resumed the chair.

Hon WONG Sing-chi replied.

Question on the motion put.

Hon WONG Sing-chi claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 23 were present, seven were in favour of the motion, 14 against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 26 were present, 21 were in favour of the motion, three against it and one abstained. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Opposing the surge of fees and charges

Hon CHAN Kam-lam moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, while the public have yet to benefit from the slight improvement in Hong Kong's economy, the Government and a considerable number of public and private organizations have chosen to propose increases in fees and charges at this stage, thereby aggravating the burden on the public; in this regard, this Council urges the Government to face up to the surge of fees and charges, and continue to freeze government fees and charges which have a direct impact on people's livelihood; at the same time, this Council calls on the public utilities to go through the hard times with the public by freezing their fees and charges.

Question on Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Fred LI, Hon LAU Chin-shek and Hon James TIEN would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the three amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Fred LI, Hon LAU Chin-shek and Hon James TIEN spoke respectively on the motion and their amendments.

19 Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon CHAN Kam-lam spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for the Treasury spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Fred LI moved the following amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion:

To delete "urges" and substitute with "strongly opposes"; to delete "to face up to the surge of fees and charges, and continue to freeze government" and substitute with "increasing its"; to add ", including charges for water, sewage and postage" after "direct impact on people's livelihood"; to delete "calls on" and substitute with "strongly opposes increases in fares and charges by"; and to delete "to go through the hard times with the public by freezing their fees and charges" and substitute with "and transport companies, such as Hongkong Electric Company Limited, Tate's Cairn Tunnel, Tai Lam Tunnel, Western Harbour Crossing, New World First Bus Services Limited and Star Ferry Company Limited".

Question on Hon Fred LI's amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion proposed and put.

Hon Fred LI claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, five were in favour of the amendment and 20 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 26 were present, 11 were in favour of the amendment and 14 against it. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions being claimed in respect of the remaining motions to be moved to the motion on Opposing the surge of fees and charges at this meeting, Rule 47(1)(c) of the Rules of Procedure be suspended so that the President may order that the Council do proceed to each of such divisions immediately after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon LAU Chin-shek moved the following amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion:

To delete "which have a direct impact on people's livelihood"; to add "in order to safeguard people's livelihood," after "at the same time,"; to delete "calls on" and substitute with "strongly opposes"; and to delete "to go through the hard times with the public by freezing" and substitute with "increasing".

Question on Hon LAU Chin-shek's amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion proposed and put and negatived.

Hon James TIEN moved the following amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion:

To add "and the business environment" after "direct impact on people's livelihood"; to delete "to go" and substitute with ", apart from having regard for making reasonable returns, to also consider the factor of going"; and to delete "by freezing" and substitute with "when considering whether or not to adjust".

Question on Hon James TIEN's amendment to Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion proposed and put.

Hon James TIEN claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, 17 were in favour of the amendment and eight against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 26 were present, five were in favour of the amendment and 20 against it. (Voting record in Appendix IV.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon CHAN Kam-lam replied.

Question on Hon CHAN Kam-lam's motion put.

Hon CHAN Kam-lam claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, 11 were in favour of the motion, two against it and 12 abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through

direct elections and by the Election Committee, 26 were present, 19 were in favour of the motion, three against it and three abstained. (Voting record in Appendix V.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 6 December 2000 at 2:30 pm.
