The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Attachment of Income Orders (Amendment) Bill 2001

The Secretary for Home Affairs moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Banking (Amendment) Bill 2001

The Secretary for Financial Services moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Appropriation Bill 2001

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 7 March 2001 resumed.

The Chief Secretary for Administration, the Secretary for Justice, the Secretary for Health and Welfare, the Secretary for Economic Services, the Secretary for the Environment and Food and the Secretary for Education and Manpower spoke on the motion.

The Financial Secretary replied.

Question on the Second Reading put.

Hon Emily LAU claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that 60 Members were present, 41 were in favour of the motion and 18 against it. (Voting record in

Appendix I.) Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, she declared that the motion was carried.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the Appropriation Bill 2001.

In accordance with Rule 68 of the Rules of Procedure, the Committee first considered the schedule to the Bill.

Question that the sums for heads 21 to 31, 35, 37, 39, 40, 42 to 51, 53, 55, 56, 58, 60, 62, 63, 70, 72, 74, 76, 78, 79, 80, 82, 90, 91, 92, 94, 95, 96, 98, 100, 106, 110, 112, 114, 115, 116, 118, 120, 121, 130, 136, 142 to 155, 160, 162, 163, 166, 168, 170, 173 to 177, 180, 181, 184, 186, 188, 190 and 194 stand part of the schedule proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that head 122 stand part of the schedule proposed.

Hon James TO moved that head 122 be reduced by \$61,849,000 in respect of subhead 000 and addressed the Committee.

Nine Members and the Secretary for Security spoke on the amendment.

Hon James TO spoke again.

Question on the amendment put.

Hon James TO claimed a division. The Chairman then ordered the Committee to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The Chairman announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 26 were present, five were in favour of the amendment, 20 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 28 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendment and 13 against it. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon James TO moved that head 122 be reduced by \$103,466,000 in respect of subhead 103 and addressed the Committee.

Three Members spoke on the amendment.

At 6:25 pm, the Chairman's Deputy took the chair during the temporary absence of the Chairman.

Another Member and the Secretary for Security spoke on the amendment.

At 6:40 pm, the Chairman resumed the chair.

Hon James TO spoke again.

Question on the amendment put.

Hon James TO claimed a division. The Chairman then ordered the Committee to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The Chairman announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 26 were present, four were in favour of the amendment, 21 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 29 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendment, 13 against it and one abstained. (Voting record in Appendix III.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Question that the sum for head 122 stand part of the schedule proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that the schedule stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 1 and 2 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Financial Secretary reported that

the Appropriation Bill 2001

had passed through the Committee without amendment. He moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed and put.

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that 55 Members were present, 36 were in favour of the motion and 18 against it. (Voting record in Appendix IV.) Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, she declared that the motion was carried.

Question that clauses 4, 5 and 8, headings before clause 16 and clause 16 stand part of the Bill proposed.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.
