First Reading

Boilers and Pressure Vessels (Amendment) Bill 2001

The Bill was read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Boilers and Pressure Vessels (Amendment) Bill 2001

The Secretary for Education and Manpower moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Members' Motions

Mechanism for handling complaints concerning medical incidents

Hon Andrew CHENG moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the credibility of the existing mechanism for handling complaints concerning medical incidents is being questioned by various sectors of the community, and the public have no confidence in the ability of the mechanism to handle complaints in a fair and independent manner, this Council urges the Government to immediately take measures to improve the existing mechanism, including reforming the Medical Council of Hong Kong's composition, operation and procedures for handling complaints; this Council also urges the Government to set up an independent mechanism for handling complaints concerning medical incidents.

Question on Hon Andrew CHENG's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Howard YOUNG would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Howard YOUNG moved the following amendment to Hon Andrew CHENG's motion and addressed the Council:

To add "in the wake of the 'mobile phone doctor' incident" after "various sectors of the community"; and to delete "set up an independent" after "this Council also urges the Government to" and substitute with "expeditiously complete the work on reforming the".

Question on Hon Howard YOUNG's amendment to Hon Andrew CHENG's motion proposed.

19 Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon Andrew CHENG spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for Health and Welfare spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Hon Howard YOUNG's amendment to Hon Andrew CHENG's motion put.

Dr Hon YEUNG Sum claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 24 were present, 15 were in favour of the amendment, seven against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 27 were present, six were in favour of the amendment and 20

against it. (Voting record in Appendix I.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Andrew CHENG replied.

Question on Hon Andrew CHENG's motion put.

Hon Andrew CHENG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, seven were in favour of the motion, nine against it and nine abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections and by the Election Committee, 28 were present, 22 were in favour of the motion and five against it. (Voting record in Appendix II.) Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, she declared that the motion was negatived.

Landscaped development and greening policy

Hon LAU Ping-cheung moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council urges the Government to immediately review the distribution of the natural and landscape resources in Hong Kong for the purpose of formulating a territory-wide landscaped development and greening policy, and to designate a policy bureau to monitor and co-ordinate the effective implementation of the policy by various government departments in carrying out town planning and infrastructural projects, in order to achieve the goal of sustainable development; at the same time, the Government should improve the existing conditions of the urban areas through re-planning and other measures so as to enhance the quality of the living environment.

At 6:57 pm, the President's Deputy took the chair during the temporary absence of the President.

Question on the motion proposed.

Three Members spoke on the motion.

At 7:25 pm, the President resumed the chair.

Another nine Members and the Secretary for Planning and Lands spoke on the motion.

Hon LAU Ping-cheung replied.

Question on the motion put and agreed to.

Next Meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 16 May 2001 at 2:30 pm.

The Council was adjourned at 8:34 pm.
