Restructuring of Panels

Purpose

This paper invites members to endorse the proposed changes to the terms of reference of each of the 17 current Panels. It also seeks Members' agreement to the proposed terms of reference of the proposed Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene and the arrangements for Members to signify membership for the Panels concerned.

Proposed Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene

- 2. At the House Committee meeting held on 20 October 2000, members decided that a new Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene should be set up to monitor Government policies relating to food safety and environmental hygiene.
- 3. At present, policy matters relating to food safety and environmental hygiene are under the purview of the Panel on Health Services and Panel on Environmental Affairs respectively. In drawing up the proposed terms of reference for the proposed Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene, the Secretariat has consulted the Administration and incorporated their suggestions in the present proposal.
- 4. It is suggested that, in addition to food safety and environmental hygiene, issues relating to agriculture and fisheries, hitherto covered by the Panel on Health Services, be brought within the purview of the proposed Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene. The resultant changes to the terms of reference of the Panel on Health Services and Panel on Environmental Affairs have the support of the two Panels.

Proposed changes to the terms of reference of existing Panels

5. At the House Committee meeting on 20 October 2000, members were consulted on a proposal to revise the terms of reference of existing Panels, taking into account the recent reshuffling of responsibilities among different Government bureaux and other technical amendments as suggested by the Secretariat. Members agreed that individual Panels should be invited to consider their respective terms of reference before they were recommended by the House Committee for the Council's approval. The round of meetings conducted for the purpose was completed in late November.

Proposals

Setting up of new Panel and other changes

6. As the Panels and the terms of reference of Panels require the approval of the Council, a resolution will have to be moved to effect the various changes as recommended by the House Committee. Subject to members' agreement, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW LIANG Shuk-yee, Chairman of the House Committee, will move the resolution at the Legislative Council meeting on 20 December 2000. The draft wording of the resolution is in the **Appendix**.

Signification of memberships of Panels concerned

7. As regards signification of membership, it is proposed that all Members, except the President of the Council, be invited to signify membership for the proposed Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene on or before 29 December 2000. In view of the reshuffling of the responsibilities of the Panel on Economic Services and the Panel on Commerce and Industry (currently known as the Panel on Trade and Industry), it is also proposed that membership of these two Panels be re-opened to Members. Any Members who wish to join these Panels should be allowed to do so, also on or before 29 December 2000.

Decision sought

8. Members are requested to endorse the proposed arrangements in paragraphs 6 and 7 above.
