Response to Members' enquiries in the Subcommittee meeting held on 13 December 2000

Dutiable Commodities (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2000

- (a) The unit cost for issue of a temporary liquor licence per day in 1995 when the fee was last revised was \$874. This unit cost would mean \$1,167 in today's prices after inflationary adjustment as compared to the current unit cost of \$1,633. The increase of unit cost is primarily due to the need to step up the vetting of the details of each application, including more thorough physical inspection of the intended venue. Having regard to the nature, scale and duration of the events, appropriate licensing conditions have to be imposed as necessary to ensure public safety and order in these events for which temporary liquor licences are issued. Hence, additional manpower has been deployed since 1995 for processing these licences, involving more rigorous vetting and also higher level Police officers.
