In today's (9 July2001) Legislative Council Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting meeting, the Secretary for Information Technology and Broadcasting, Mrs. Carrie Yau, said that Government had expended around \$2.2 billion to implement measures to address the issue of digital divide. Detailed breakdown is as follows-
