LegCo Panel on Manpower Admission of Mainland Professionals

On behalf of the Executive Council of this Association, I write to respond to your letter of

16 March 2001 addressed to Prof POON Chung-kwong, President of the Hong Kong

Polytechnic University, inviting views from the university's academics on the Admission of

Mainland Professionals Scheme.

I would like to express support for the Scheme both as an immigration issue and an

economics issue, and also to express reservation from a manpower development

perspective.

As an immigration issue, the Scheme extends the Hong Kong SAR's current liberal policy

on the admission of foreign professionals to cover professionals from the Mainland. In fact,

we do not see any reason why the SAR should discriminate against qualified Mainland

professionals in preference for foreign professionals.

As an economics issue, the Scheme helps alleviate the SAR's immediate manpower shortage in particular professional sectors, generate enhanced economic activities and employment opportunities, and facilitate professional exchange between the mainland, the SAR and the rest of the world. The Scheme clearly brings economic benefits and it should therefore be supported.

From a manpower development perspective, on the other hand, the Scheme together with recent government action to cut university budgets beg the question of whether Government is gradually shifting towards a policy of "downsizing" local professional education providers (e.g. universities) and "outsourcing" professional education services to service providers outside the SAR. If this is indeed the case, then Government is extremely shortsighted and its action is most likely to damage the SAR's long-term competitiveness and future well-being.
