Dear Mrs Tong,

The Finance Bureau and the Education and Manpower Bureau are actively looking into means to improve the arrangements for contracting out Government services in a manner that would not compromise the free market and fair competition principles. We plan to ask departments which are contracting out their low-skill services to require tenderers to set out clearly in the work proposal of their tender submissions the planned number of employees, the wage levels offered, working hours required etc. In tender evaluation, the Government departments concerned would consider, apart from the tender price, whether the conditions of employment offered by tenderers to their prospective employees are reasonable and whether they can provide quality service. We would request departments concerned to develop objective marking schemes to ensure an appropriate balance between the quality of the tender proposal and the tender price.

2. It is also our intention to require all successful tenderers to be

bound by the terms and conditions offered in their tender submissions upon

award of contract and would make provision that unauthorized departure

would constitute a breach of contract. For monitoring purpose, we would

require contractors to sign written employment contracts with employees,

specifying their wages and other major terms of employment so that

employees may fully understand their rights and benefits as well as to facilitate

monitoring in future.

3. We are currently consulting related departments on the new

arrangements and will announce the details in one to two months' time. In the

meantime, the Labour Department and other departments concerned will

continue to carry out inspections and take enforcement actions to safeguard

the reasonable rights of the employees as provided by the law.
