Submission before Security Panel Meeting on 25 November, 2000

As mentioned on the telephone last week, I would like to appear personally before the Panel on Security on 25 November, to make my submission on the Public Order Ordinance. My efforts to air my views through the English press have been rejected by the Editors, so I am glad to have this opportunity.

The main points of my submission are:-

- * My own part in the enactment of the POOs in 1995 and 1997;
