### I. Meeting with the Administration

(LC Paper No. CB(2)2847/01-02(01))

The Bills Committee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at the **Annex**).

- 2. Having regard to the concerns raised by members about the lack of deterrent effect and cost-effectiveness of the Bill, the Administration agreed to re-consider the following issues raised by members and provide a written response to such prior to the next meeting -
  - (a) There should be an automatic mechanism for payment of interest on maintenance arrears, i.e. once the court issued an order to enforce a maintenance order, interest on arrears of maintenance payments should be automatically calculated; and
  - (b) The court should have the discretion to impose a surcharge where the maintenance payer had defaulted in payment without reasonable excuse. The levying of surcharge on late maintenance payment could take the form of a percentage of arrears similar to surcharge on late tax payment. Alternatively, consideration could be given to setting a ceiling for the surcharge, say, at three times of the amount of the maintenance arrears.
- 3. The Administration was also requested to provide information on the number of Legal Aid Department and Social Welfare Department staff involved in the enforcement of maintenance payments and the costs incurred prior to the next

meeting.

- 4. As the various legislative amendments implemented hitheto to improve the enforcement of maintenance orders were ineffective, <u>Dr LAW Chi-kwong</u>, <u>Ms Cyd HO</u>, <u>Mr Albert HO</u>, <u>Ms LI Fung-ying</u>, <u>Miss CHOY So-yuk</u>, <u>Ms Audrey EU and the Chairman</u> were of the view that the Administration should re-examine the proposal of setting up an intermediary body for the collection and enforcement of maintenance payments.
- 5. The Chairman proposed and members agreed that the clerk should prepare a paper setting out members' views on setting up an intermediary body for the collection and enforcement of maintenance payments or other proposal(s) to expedite maintenance recovery and strengthen support for those in financial difficulty. The draft paper would be issued to members and the Administration for comments, and would be incorporated in the Bills Committee report for the House Committee's consideration.

#### II. Date of next meeting

- 6. <u>Members</u> agreed to hold the next meeting on 4 November 2002 at 8:30 am to continue discussion on the Bill.
- 7. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 12:05 pm.
