I. Meeting with the Administration

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to provide a response on the suggestion of incorporating in the Bill an express provision that the Police should maintain the confidentiality of information on a case of possession of child pornography until prosecution was instituted.
- 3. The Bills Committee requested the legal adviser to the Bills Committee to prepare the respective sets of draft Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) to reflect the following scenarios -
 - (a) in respect of the "passive possession" of unsolicited child pornography received by means of electronic transmission, to provide that the defendant's knowledge of the exact nature of the thing in possession was to be proved by the prosecution;

- (b) retaining clause 3(3) of the Bill but removing as far as practicable the objective standard in clause 4 relating to a charge under clause 3(3); and
- (c) adding the element of "knowingly" in clause 3(3) and adjusting the relevant defences in clause 4 accordingly.
- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> suggested that the Bills Committee should come to a decision at the next meeting on whether to accept the Administration's proposed CSAs or move its own CSAs regarding provisions relating to the possession of child pornography.

II. Dates of subsequent meetings

- 5. The Bills Committee agreed that the next two meetings would be held on 29 May 2003 at 10:45 am and 5 June 2003 at 10:45 am to continue discussion with the Administration.
