# Bills

#### Second Reading

Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) Bill 2001

#### Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 23 May 2001 resumed.

Hon Ambrose LAU, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) Bill 2001, addressed the Council on the Report of the Bills Committee on the Bill.

Four Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Financial Services replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

#### Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) Bill 2001.

Question that clauses 1, 3, 5, 6, 12, 13, 14 and 16 to 21 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 2, 4, 7 to 11 and 15 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Financial Services moved amendments to clauses 2, 4 and 7 to 11 and the deletion of clause 15 and addressed the Committee.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

The Chairman stated that as the amendment to clause 15, which dealt with deletion, had been agreed, clause 15 was therefore deleted from the Bill.

Question that clauses 2, 4 and 7 to 11, as amended, stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

New clause 2A read the first time.

The Secretary for Financial Services moved the Second Reading of new clause 2A and addressed the Committee.

Question on the Second Reading of new clause 2A proposed, put and agreed to.

New clause 2A read the second time.

The Secretary for Financial Services moved the addition of new clause 2A to the Bill.

Question on the addition proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that the schedule stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Financial Services moved amendments to the schedule and addressed the Committee.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that the schedule, as amended, stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

### Third Reading

The Secretary for Financial Services reported that

the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) Bill 2001

had passed through the Committee with amendments. He moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

While Hon CHOY So-yuk was speaking, the President left the chair at 5:48 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

At 6:10 pm, while Hon Tommy CHEUNG was speaking, the President resumed the chair.
