New clause 5A read the second time.

The Secretary for Transport moved the addition of the new clause 5A to the Bill.

While Hon SIN Chung-kai was addressing the Council, the President left the chair at 5:00 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

12 Members and Hon Ambrose LAU spoke on the motion.

At 6:18 pm, while Hon Ambrose LAU was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Another seven Members and the Secretary for the Treasury spoke on the motion.

The President allowed another Member who had not spoken to speak on the motion.

Hon SIN Chung-kai replied.

Question on the motion put and agreed to.

#### Promoting community spirit

Hon TAM Yiu-chung moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That, as the economy is in the doldrums and people are under immense pressure, with suicide and family violence incidents occurring repeatedly recently, this Council urges Government to allocate additional resources to services and actively promote the development of the "third sector", so as to optimize the social capital, promote community development services, encourage self-help and mutual support among the public, strengthen the community support network, enhance the capabilities of individuals and families in solving their problems in life and prevent family violence, for the purposes of cultivating the community spirit of mutual support, care and love among residents.

Question on the motion proposed.

18 Members and the Secretary for Health and Welfare spoke on the motion.

Hon TAM Yiu-chung replied.

Question on the motion put and agreed to.
