## **Meeting with the Administration**

The Subcommittee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. As suggested by the Subcommittee, the Administration undertook to consider amending the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance (Cap. 503) to provide a clearer legislative mandate for future Orders to specify exceptions to the political offence restriction on surrender contained in section 5(1)(a) of Cap. 503. The Administration pointed out, however, that such an amendment would be for "the avoidance of doubt" and that a number of previous Orders which contained such exceptions had been validly made in accordance with the provisions of section 3(1) and (9) of Cap. 503.
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> said that he was just informed by the Hong Kong Human Rights Monitor that it would make a further written submission to the Subcommittee. The submission, when received, would be circulated to members.
- 4. The Subcommittee agreed that -
  - (a) subject to members' agreement, a further meeting might be convened to discuss new issue, if any, raised in the further submission of the Hong Kong Human Rights Monitor; and
  - (b) if no further meeting was required, a report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee would be made to the House Committee on 12 April 2002.
