I. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper No.CB(2) 105/02-03(01)]

The Bills Committee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>Members</u> in general expressed support for bringing rave parties and other dancing activities held at premises not licensed for dancing activities under the ambit of Place of the Public Entertainment Ordinance (the Ordinance). Members, however, expressed concern that the proposed licensing regime was too wide and would bring about unnecessary administrative workload and financial burden to decent organisers of dance parties such as voluntary organisations and students of tertiary education institutions. They held a strong view that a Place of Public Entertainment (PPE) licence should not be required for dance parties held in premises of voluntary organisations, tertiary education institutions and schools whose compliance with standard safety requirements for public assembly had been certified. A member added

that the Administration should consider including voluntary organisations in the Exemption Order and providing them with a code of practice on safety requirements for premises which would be kept or used for specific purposes such as a dance party.

- 3. The Administration responded that most dance parties organised by community organisations and voluntary organisations for the general public were held in premises managed by the Leisure, Cultural and Services Department (LCSD) and the Home Affairs Department (HAD) and such premises would be exempted from application of the Ordinance. Only a few of them would need to apply for a PPE licence for holding parties in premises which were not included in the Exemption Order.
- 4. <u>Members</u> considered that the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department should expedite the processing time for the issue of a PPE licence to seven working days. <u>Members</u> also considered that the existing fee (over \$10,000) for an annual PPE licence was too expensive for voluntary organisations.
- 5. The Administration was requested to provide a response to the following
 - (a) amending the Exemption Order to include premises under the management of public bodies, voluntary organisations, tertiary education institutions and public sector schools;
 - (b) making special administrative arrangement for processing temporary PPE licence applications for dance parties made by non-profit-making organisations within seven working days and charging a nominal licence fee for these applications in accordance with regulation 178 of the PPE Regulation; and
 - (c) clarifying whether an organiser of a rave party could evade the regulation by granting membership of a dancing club to every participant who would be admitted to the dance venue the day after membership registeration, instead of instant admission.

<u>Legislative timetable</u>

6. The Chairman advised that the scrutiny period of the Amendment Regulation and Exemption Order would expire on 6 November 2002 and the deadline for proposing amendments was 30 October 2002. The Subcommittee would have to report to the House Committee on 25 October 2002. In view of the tight schedule, the Chairman requested and the Administration undertook to provide a written response to paragraphs 5 (a) to (c) before 11:00 am on Tuesday, 22 October 2002. The Clerk would circulate the response to

members for comments once it was available. <u>Members</u> would be requested to give their comments to the Clerk, if any, before the close of play on 23 October 2002. In case negative comments were received from members, <u>the Chairman</u> said that he would, as an individual member, move a motion to repeal the Amendment Regulation and Exemption Order at the Council meeting on 6 November 2002 so that Legislative Council Members would have the opportunity to express their views on the two pieces of subsidiary legislation and cast their votes accordingly at the meeting.

7. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 5:20 pm.
