Measures adopted by the Central People's Government (CPG) to implement United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 1373

At its meeting on 5 February 2002, the Legislative Council Panel on Security requested the Administration to provide information on the legislative and administrative measures adopted by the CPG to implement UNSCR 1373, and the list of terrorists. After consulting the CPG, the Administration would like to provide the Panel with the following information.

- 2. The CPG firmly advocates combating terrorism in all its forms, and strict implementation of Security Council resolutions. supports Immediately following the adoption of UNSCR 1373, as authorized by the State Council, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, by administrative order, informed and asked all CPG departments, provincial, municipal and autonomous region Governments, and the Governments of the Hong Kong and Macao Special Administrative Regions to fully, earnestly and rigorously implement all the The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has also provisions of the resolution. circulated a list of the organizations and individuals suspected of involvement in terrorist activities compiled by the Committee established under UNSCR 1373 to all CPG departments, provincial, municipal and autonomous region Governments, and the Governments of the Hong Kong and Macao Special Administrative Regions.
- At its ninth session in December 2001, the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress passed the Amendments to the Criminal Law of the People's Republic of China, to define more clearly the measures to punish terrorist crimes.
