# Statistics in relation to Taking of Body Samples for investigation of crimes

#### **Purpose**

This paper is to provide Members with statistics for the period from January to June 2002 in relation to the implementation of the Dangerous Drugs, Independent Commission Against Corruption and Police Force (Amendment) Ordinance 2000 (the Ordinance). The Ordinance empowers authorized law enforcement officers to take body samples from suspects for the investigation of crimes under specified conditions.

#### **Background**

- 2. At the meetings of the then Bills Committee on the Dangerous Drugs, Independent Commission Against Corruption and Police Force (Amendment) Bill 1999 held in June 2000, Members requested the Administration to provide to the LegCo Panel on Security (Panel) statistics on samples taken under the Ordinance.
- 3. The Ordinance came into operation on 1 July 2001. The first set of statistics covering the period from 1 July 2001 to 31 December 2001 was provided to the Panel in January 2002.

#### **Statistics for the Period from January to June 2002**

- 4. The following statistics covering the period from 1 January 2002 to 30 June 2002 are attached
  - (a) general statistics on the number of samples taken;
  - (b) intimate samples taken from suspects by types of samples;
  - (c) non-intimate samples taken from suspects by types of samples; and
  - (d) serious arrestable offences for which samples were taken from suspects.
- 5. Under the Ordinance, a DNA database storing DNA information derived from samples taken from persons convicted of serious arrestable offence and from non-intimate samples given by volunteers will be set up. As at 30 June 2002, DNA information derived from 926 samples taken from persons convicted of serious arrestable offences and 307 samples from volunteers has been stored in the DNA database. Such information will be used for comparison with DNA information derived from crime scenes to help the detection of serious crimes.
