Mr TAM Yiu-chung suggested that the Bills Committee should meet with the concern group on the minor works (MW) control regime formed by small minor works contractors, and the Hong Kong Licensed Plumbers Association Limited, as both organizations had raised concerns about the proposed MW control regime and registration system for MW contractors. Members agreed.

Clause 4(d) - proposed section 3(5CA)(a)(i) of the Buildings Ordinance (BO)

- 4. <u>Some members</u> expressed concern over the propriety of adopting "15 years of experience in geotechnical engineering" as a requirement for the three registered professional engineers in the geotechnical engineering discipline nominated by the Engineers Registration Board to sit in the Geotechnical Engineers Registration Committee during the first year of operation of the Committee. They also pointed out that it was unclear whether the experience referred to in the provision meant "post-qualification experience". <u>Dr Raymond HO</u> agreed to consult the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (HKIE) on the 15-year experience requirement and whether the provision should be revised to specify that the experience required of members should be "post-qualification experience".
- 5. The Administration undertook to check whether it had received written views from HKIE expressing support for the proposed 15-year experience in the proposed section 3(5CA)(a)(i) of BO.
