- 3. The Administration was requested to provide a paper to explain the following concerns raised by members:
 - (a) Whether individuals who satisfied the specified requirements but without business registration could be registered as contractors and minor works contractors under the existing Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123) and the Bill respectively;
 - (b) Whether persons with a plumber's licence issued under Regulation 34 of the Waterworks Regulations (Cap. 102 sub. leg.) would be recognized as registered minor works contractors under the Bill;
 - (c) If the answer to (b) was affirmative, whether persons with a plumber's licence would require to be registered separately under the Bill and what types of minor works they would be permitted to undertake. The deputations claimed that persons with a plumber's licence were qualified and should be permitted to undertake drainage works; and
 - (d) How the proposed registration system for minor works contractors under the Bill could be tied in with the mandatory registration system for construction workers under the Construction Workers Registration Bill currently under scrutiny by the Legislative Council.
