The Bills Committee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at the **Appendix**).

The way forward on the minor works control regime

- 2. <u>Members</u> noted that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss and decide the way forward on the minor works (MW) control regime in the Bill. The Administration had assessed policy, operational and drafting implications of the four different options suggested by members to deal with the MW control regime.
- 3. In order to allow sufficient time for conducting further consultation with the MW sector on the lists of MW and registration criteria of registered MW contractors, as well as to enable the Bills Committee to focus on the scrutiny of less controversial proposals in the Bill, members in general considered that option 1 to delete the whole MW control regime from the Bill, was the appropriate way forward. Option 1 was also supported by the Administration

because it was less complicated than other options in terms of drafting and implementation. Mr Andrew WONG, however, expressed reservation over option 1 and considered that option 3 - designating certain types of Category III and/or Category IV MW as exempted works, and option 4 - defer commencement of provisions on Category III and/or Category IV MW, could be further examined. After discussion, the Bills Committee agreed to adopt option 1.
