(b) to compile a table setting out the respective planning and land matters on which enforcement actions could be taken by the Planning Authority under the Town Planning Ordinance and/or other land authorities under other ordinances; and

(c) to provide a paper to explain why proposed section 23(9A) was necessary to deter proliferation of unauthorized developments. The Administration should illustrate with examples the difficulties encountered by the prosecution, if any, in proving the constitution or existence of unauthorized developments. Some members were concerned that the proposed section did not accord with the common law principle that the burden of proof rested on the prosecution.
