(d) to advise whether similar overseas legislation adopted the same criterion of "material change" in considering acceptance or otherwise of further information relating to applications for amendments of plans and planning permission and whether many cases arose on its interpretation. At members' request, the Administration would provide case law, if any, on the interpretation of "material change".
