#### I. Meeting with deputations and the Administration

The deliberation of the Bills Committee was outlined in the index of proceedings at **Annex**.

2. <u>Members</u> noted the submission of the Education Convergence which was tabled at the meeting [LC Paper No.CB(2)1326/03-04(03)].

#### Meeting with deputations

- 3. The Bills Committee received views from the following eight deputations and individual on the Bill -
  - (a) Committee on Home-School Co-operation;
  - (b) Hong Kong Christian Council;
  - (c) Federation of Parent Teacher Associations in Kwun Tong District;
  - (d) Hong Kong Association of Heads of Secondary Schools;
  - (e) The Joint Counsel of Parent-Teacher Associations of the Shatin District [LC Paper No. CB(2)1297/03-04(01)];
  - (f) Sisters of the Precious Blood;
  - (g) Hong Kong Private School Association; and

- (h) Mr TIK Chi-yuen.
- 4. <u>Members</u> noted that some representatives considered that the Bills Committee should speed up its deliberation work to facilitate early enactment of the Bill which would provide a legal backup for parents to participate in the work of an Incorporated Management Committee (IMC). <u>Members</u> explained to deputations that the Bill contained a number of complex and controversial issues, including the distribution of powers and functions between the School Sponsoring Bodies (SSB) and IMC under the proposed governance structure for aided schools, which should be examined in detail.

#### Meeting with the Administration

- 5. <u>Members</u> requested the Administration to -
  - (a) explain how enactment of the Bill would pave the way for implementation of the one-line vote arrangement for provision of recurrent funding for aided schools; and the implications of such arrangement on the implementation of school-based management in aided schools; and
  - (b) explain the relationship between school-based management and self-evaluations conducted by schools, and the effects of conducting such self-evaluations on the workload of teachers.

<u>Members</u> agreed that the issues raised might be outside the scope of the Bill and the Administration's response should also be circulated to the Panel on Education for reference.
