I. Meeting with the Administration

<u>Members</u> deliberated on the Administration's response to the issues raised at the meeting on 14 April 2004 [LC Paper No. CB(2)2066/03-04(01)] (Index of proceedings at **Annex**).

- 2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to -
 - (a) elaborate on the requirements for the operation of aided schools and Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS) schools under the service agreements before and after enactment of the Bill;
 - (b) describe the views of the school councils which had been consulted on the suggestion that new DSS schools commencing operation on or after the commencement of the Bill, except those that had entered into an agreement with the Administration previously, should be required to establish an Incorporated Management Committee (IMC);
 - (c) consult the relevant school councils, SSBs and organisations on whether aided schools should have the option to establish an IMC;
 - (d) examine whether SSBs, by virtue of the terms and conditions of the existing service agreements between SSBs and the Administration, could institute legal proceedings against the Administration on the mandatory requirement for aided schools to establish an IMC under the Bill;

- (e) consider whether a way out could be provided for IMC schools which had encountered difficulties in the implementation of the requirements of the Bill within the transitional period;
- (f) specify the power of a SSB to dissolve an IMC and form a new School Management Committee when an aided school with an established IMC changed to become a DSS school; and
- (g) consider incorporating a general provision to specify the power of SSB to decide on issues which fell outside the scope of the functions and powers of IMC in proposed new sections 40AD(2), 40AE(1) and (2).

Providing aided schools with the option to establish an IMC

3. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> said that he considered it unfair to adopt different policies for aided schools and DSS schools in the establishment of an IMC, i.e., aided schools were required to establish an IMC with a transitional period of five years while DSS schools were given the option to establish an IMC or not. He suggested that the Administration should give the option to both types of schools for a period of five years after the commencement of the Bill, and review the need to amend the Education Ordinance in the light of the experience of IMC schools in operation during the period. <u>Mr CHEUNG</u> added that he would consider proposing a Committee Stage amendment (CSA) to the effect that all schools should have the option to establish an IMC within five years after the commencement of the Bill. <u>Members</u> in general agreed that the Administration should explore the feasibility of Mr CHEUNG's suggestion and provide a written response.

II. Clause-by-clause examination of the Bill [LC Paper No. CB(2)1964/03-04(01)]

4. <u>Members</u> deliberated on Clause 17 of the Bill (proposed sections 40AC, 40AD, 40AE and 40AEA under Part IIIB of the Education Ordinance - index of proceedings at **Annex**).

Section 40AD - Functions of SSB and IMC

5. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> suggested that there should be express provisions in proposed new section 40AE to reflect the power of SSBs to oversee the performance of IMCs as provided under proposed new section 40AD(1)(f). He also suggested that drafting of section 40AD(2)(f) should be refined. The Administration undertook to consider his suggestions.

Section 40AE - Powers of IMC

- 6. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to -
 - (a) liaise with the legal profession regarding the provision of voluntary legal service to support SSBs, parent-teacher associations, alumni associations, etc., in the establishment and on-going operation of an IMC;
 - (b) provide a sample IMC constitution as soon as practicable;
 - (c) provide sample guidelines on the power of IMC to raise funds and enter into any contract, agreement or arrangement involving the use of private funds which was not provided by the Government, referred to in proposed new section 40AE(3)(ba);
 - (d) review the need for section 40AE(3)(b) which provided that the exercise of the power of an IMC shall be subject to any direction given by the Permanent Secretary for Education and Manpower (PSEM) under section 40CC, having regard to the fact that under section 82(1), PSEM might give directions to the IMC of any school for the purposes of ensuring that the school was operated satisfactorily or the education of the pupils of the school was promoted in a proper manner;
 - (e) clarify whether the directions given by PSEM under proposed new section 40AE(3)(b) would override the provisions under the Codes of Aid for aided primary, secondary and special schools in case of any inconsistency; and
 - (f) refine the drafting of section 40AE(3)(ba).

Section 40AEA - Power of a sponsoring body over employment of teaching staff

Admin 7. <u>Mr LEE Cheuk-yan</u> suggested that the Administration should consider redrafting of proposed new section 40AEA to the effect that non-teaching staff would be included under the section.

Other issues

Implications of the Bill on one- line vote arrangement for aided schools

8. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> noted the recent newspaper reports on the Administration's plan to allow schools to delink staff salaries from the civil service pay for new recruits not exceeding 20% of the approved establishment

Admin by way of a one-line vote arrangement. He requested the Administration to clarify the policy intent and the implications of the Bill on implementation of a one-line vote arrangement in the school sector.

Arrangements for merger of schools

9. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> asked whether the Administration would consider incorporating provisions in the Bill to cater for the merger of schools in the light of its latest policy on the provision of public sector school places. <u>The Chairman</u> requested the Administration to examine the issue and provide a written response.
