#### I. Meeting with the Administration [LC Paper No. CB(2)2787/03-04(01)]

The Bills Committee deliberated (Index of proceedings at Annex).

2. <u>The Clerk</u> informed the meeting that the Chairman had advised that she would be late for the meeting due to another engagement, and had recommended Ms Audrey EU to take the chair until she arrived. <u>Members</u> agreed.

#### Article 141 of the Basic Law

3. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> said that one of the largest SSBs planned to initiate litigation against the Government for contravention of Article 141 of the Basic Law if the Bill was enacted. He pointed out that paragraph 3 of Article 141 provided that religious organizations may, according to their previous practice, continue to run seminaries and other schools, hospitals and welfare institutions and to provide other social services. He asked the Administration to seek legal advice as to whether the Bill was consistent with Article 141 and provide a written response before the Second Reading debate on the Bill was resumed at the Council meeting on 7 July 2004. The Administration agreed.

#### Clause-by-clause examination of the Bill

4. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to -

Regulation 56 - Boarding schools Regulation 57 - Medical examination in boarding schools (a) review whether non-compliance with the regulations should constitute a criminal offence;

Regulation 66 - Prohibition of collections without permission of Director

(b) examine whether Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS) schools should be exempted from the regulation which required schools to seek the approval of the Permanent Secretary for Education and Manpower (PSEM) for collection of fees or subscription from pupils in schools;

Regulation 76 - Teachers' appointment or dismissal needs approval by managers

- (c) specify that the appointment of teachers under the approved establishment or a contract of not less than six months should be approved by the majority of the managers of an aided school;
- (d) specify that the dismissal of any teacher employed under the approved establishment or a contract of not less than six months should be approved by the majority of the managers at a meeting of the school management committee or the Incorporated Management Committee (IMC);

#### Regulation 96 - Expulsion and suspension of pupils

(e) elaborate on the powers and authority of a principal and a supervisor, in contrast with those of the PSEM, to expel or suspend a pupil from a school;

#### Regulation 99A - Business or trading operations

(f) examine whether the scope of the regulation should cover DSS schools; and

Regulation 101 - Offences Regulation 102 - Penalties

(g) provide a summary of the proposed amendments to the offences and penalties in regulations 101 and 102.

#### CSAs proposed by members

5. The draft CSA to clause 18 (section 41) proposed by Ms Emily LAU [LC Paper No CB(2)2864/03-04(01)] and the draft CSA to clause 17 (proposed

section 40BR) proposed by the Chairman [LC Paper No CB(2)2864/03-04(02)] were tabled at the meeting for members' information.
