I. Meeting with the Administration

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to provide a written response to the following issues raised by members -

Sedition

- (a) to explain, in relation to the proposed section 9A(1)(b) of the Crimes Ordinance (CO), how to determine where incitement took place, and whether incitement by means of an electronic mail or letter would be completed -
 - (i) when it was sent; or
 - (ii) when it was read by the person to whom it was sent;

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- (b) to consider providing in the proposed section 9A(1)(b) of CO the requirement for a direct and immediate connection between the incitement and the violent public disorder or a likelihood of the incitement to cause violent public disorder;
- (c) to consider deleting the expression "in Hong Kong or elsewhere" in the proposed section 9A(1)(b) and substituting "in Hong Kong or elsewhere in the People's Republic of China";
- (d) to provide the Administration's response to the issues raised in the submissions from the Hong Kong Journalists Association, the Society of Publishers in Asia and the Hong Kong News Executives' Association on sedition;
- (e) to prepare an analysis on the legal effect of the proposed sections 9A(1)(a), 9A(1)(b) and 9B of CO;

Time limits for prosecution against treason and sedition-related offences

- (f) to consider retaining or extending the existing time limit for prosecution against sedition-related offences; and
- (g) to consider the suggestion of retaining the existing time limit for prosecution against treason.

II. Any other business

- 3. In response to Mr LEE Cheuk-yan, the Chairman said that in his contacts with the Administration, he had only requested the Administration to provide its response to issues raised by members as soon as possible. Mr James TO suggested that the Chairman should provide members with a note on the number of times and the contents of his personal meetings with the Administration. As there were divided views among members, a vote was taken on the suggestion. Eight members voted in favour of the suggestion while 17 members voted against. The Chairman reiterated that he had only requested the Administration to provide its response to issues raised by members as soon as possible.
- 4. The Chairman informed members that a total of 61 organizations/individuals had, by the deadline of 25 April 2003, made request for making oral representation to the Bills Committee. Among these, one organization had subsequently withdrawn its request. Five organizations/individuals who registered after the deadline of 25 April 2003 had been informed that there would be no arrangement for them to make oral

representation to the Bills Committee. However, they were welcome to submit views on the Bill in writing to the Bills Committee.

5. The meeting ended at 6:30 pm.
