#### I. Meeting with deputations

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)161/03-04(01) & CB(2)173/03-04(01)]

The Bills Committee received the views from the following three deputations on the Bill (Index of proceedings attached at **Annex**) -

- (a) Hong Kong Professional Teachers' Union (HKPTU);
- (b) Hong Kong Federation of Private Educators; and
- (c) Hong Kong Aided Primary School Heads Association (the Association).

2. <u>Members</u> requested the Association to assist in encouraging serving permitted teachers (PTs) to complete a recognized teacher education programme within the proposed five-year grace period. Representatives of the Association agreed to follow up the matter upon the enactment of the Bill. The Association would provide the Legislative Council Panel on Education with an information note on the agreed strategies and measures to help serving PTs acquire a recognized qualification for registration as registered teachers within the grace period.

#### II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper No. CB(2)3100/02-03(01)]

Support and training places for serving PTs

- 3. Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong held a strong view that the Administration had an obligation to ensure the provision of sufficient training places for serving PTs in primary and secondary schools who intended to complete an approved teacher education programme within the proposed five-year grace period. He requested the Administration to liaise with the Hong Kong Institute of Education (HKIEd) to resume the in-service course of training for teachers (ICTT) for enrolment of serving PTs in primary schools who had five passes in the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination. He anticipated that school principals would exercise discretion to release their serving PTs to attend ICTT classes. He also suggested that EMB should collaborate with HKPTU and primary schools to encourage serving PTs to enrol in an appropriate education programme as early as practicable.
- 4. <u>Members</u> in general agreed that the Administration should follow up with schools and HKIEd on provision of sufficient places for serving PTs who wished to acquire an approved teacher education qualification. In response to the Chairman's request, the Administration undertook to provide a paper setting out the plans and measures to encourage serving PTs to acquire an approved education qualification within the proposed grace period. <u>Mr CHEUNG Man-kwong</u> considered that the Administration should also maintain the current level of subsidy for serving PTs pursuing a part-time evening teacher education programme until the expiry of the grace period.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that serving PTs with good performance were normally assigned more non-teaching and extra-curricular duties and might have difficulty in attending the evening classes of a teacher education programme. She requested the Administration to
  - (a) encourage schools to provide appropriate support for serving PTs to attend ICTT classes;

- consider setting up a working group comprising major (b) stakeholders to monitor the implementation of the proposals in the Bill; and
- (c) provide the dropout rates of ICTT programmes in previous years.

#### Registration of day and evening schools

Members in general supported the policy that any private evening session of a school which received subsidy from the Government should be registered as a separate school. Assistant Legal Adviser (ALA) advised that he was of the view that the policy as set out in paragraph 7 of the Administration's response to issues raised at the meeting on 16 July 2003 (LC Paper No.CB(2)3100/02-03(01)) was not reflected in the Bill as presently drafted. ALA/Adm The Chairman directed ALA to liaise with the Administration on the necessary amendments to reflect the policy intent.
