Action

I. Meeting with the Administration

Educational measures to prevent gambling-related problems

The Committee received a briefing on the educational measures implemented by the Education and Manpower Bureau to prevent gambling-related problems (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Adm

- 2. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to consider the following requests from members
 - (a) to expedite the implementation of educational measures to enhance the understanding of school students about gambling problems; and
 - (b) to include informative materials in these measures apart from educational materials so that school students would have a good understanding about authorization of football betting such as prohibition of underage betting and credit betting.

<u>Issues arising from previous meetings</u> [LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2603/02-03(03) and CB(2)2603/02-03(05)]

3. The Committee deliberated the Administration's responses to the outstanding issues and concerns raised by members as well as the views expressed by deputations at previous meetings (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Adm 4. The Administration had undertaken –

- (a) to set out in the licence for authorized football betting and lotteries the operating hours for the betting premises which would be open until 11:30 pm;
- (b) to consult relevant local bodies, including the District Council concerned, for the extension of operating hours of betting premises beyond 11:30 pm in the future which would be considered on a case by case basis by the Secretary for Home Affairs (SHA);
- (c) to amend the proposed new section 6AAA in the draft Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) to be proposed by the Administration so as to include conflict of interest as one of the considerations for SHA to determine whether the licensed operator and its related persons were fit and proper;
- (d) to advise whether there were provisions in other legislation similar to the proposed new section 6Z which provided an appeal channel with the power to confirm, vary or reverse the decision of the authority;
- (e) to propose a CSA to the proposed new section 6ZF(3) to raise the penalty for contravention of section 6ZF(1) on the keeping of records of authorized football betting or lotteries from level 3 to

level 6;

- (f) to review its policy of authorization of football betting against certain benchmarks, such as the changes in the intensity of illegal gambling activities and the number of problem and pathological gamblers, and report the results to the Panel on Home Affairs in around two years' time after the legislation (if passed) had come into operation;
- (g) to commission academic institutions to conduct tracking surveys on the impact of authorization of football betting on the prevalence of problem and pathological gambling;
- (h) to make a progress report to the Panel on Home Affairs at its first regular meeting in the next legislative session on the implementation of the educational measures as well as provision of counselling and treatment services to address gambling-related problems, and enforcement action taken by the Police in combating illegal football gambling activities; and
- (i) to address the concern that authorization of football betting would lead to deteriorating moral standards in the community and explain how the Government would address the social problems arising from authorizing football betting in the SHA's speech to be delivered during the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill.
- Adm 5. The Administration was requested to provide a written response to the following requests from some members before 12:00 noon 25 June 2003 –
 - to consider amending the proposed new section 6R so as to (a) impose additional penalty on the sale of football betting tickets to juveniles; and
 - to consider amending the proposed new section 6E to the effect (b) that meetings of the Football Betting and Lotteries Commission should be open to the public, unless the Chairperson decided otherwise.

<u>Draft Committee Stage amendments (CSAs)</u> [LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2642/02-03(01) and CB(2)2661/02-03(01)]

6. The Committee deliberated the draft CSAs to be proposed by the Administration (24 June 2003 version) and those by Mr Andrew CHENG to the proposed new sections 6G, 6Z and 6ZA (index of proceedings attached at Annex).

- 7. <u>Members</u> noted that the Administration had included the amendments mentioned in paragraph 4(c) and (e) above in its draft CSAs. <u>Members</u> also noted that the Administration had made reference to the wording of section 20E of the Legislative Council Ordinance (Cap. 542) and section 4 of the Human Reproductive Technology Ordinance (Cap. 561) and amended the draft CSA to the proposed new section 6B(2) to specify the inclusion of one member each from the education, social welfare and religious sectors in the composition of the Football Betting and Lotteries Commission.
- 8. <u>Mr Andrew CHENG</u> informed members that if the Administration did not accept members' requests in paragraph 5 above, he would move CSAs accordingly.

II. Any other business

Resumption of Second Reading debate

- 9. The Administration explained to the Committee that there was a strong reason of public interest to resume the Second Reading debate on the Bill as soon as possible, i.e., on 9 July 2003. However, as the Committee had not completed its deliberations on the Bill until 24 June 2003, the Administration had not given notice for resumption on 23 June 2003, in accordance with the Rules of Procedure. The Administration therefore sought the support of the Committee for its request to the President for the requisite notice period to be waived, in order that the Bill could resume the Second Reading debate on 9 July 2003.
- 10. A vote was taken on the Administration's request. Mr Howard YOUNG, Mr Abraham SHEK and Mr Tommy CHEUNG voted in favour of the request while Mr SIN Chung-kai and Mr Andrew CHENG voted against. Hon Cyd HO was abstained from voting. The Committee decided to submit a written report to the House Committee at its meeting on 27 June 2003 and recommend that the Administration's request to the President for the requisite notice period for resumption of the Secondary Reading debate on the Bill to be waived be supported.
- 11. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 4:45 pm.
