If existing legislation could only cover part of section 11(2), whether amendments to section 11(2) or to the general law should be made to cover what was necessary;
- (b) Whether the definition of "terrorist act" also covered false threat of terrorist act;
- (c) In relation to the recent court case convicting a man under section 11(2) of the Ordinance, when did the information that the offender had previous records of psychiatric treatment come to light, and who first got hold of such information; and
- (d) Whether there were any internal guidelines for enforcing the Ordinance; if so; what were they.

3. The Administration was also requested to provide a written response to the following issues raised by members -

- (a) To examine how to protect the interests of "innocent parties" who had unknowingly provided/invested funds/other property to/in terrorists/terrorist organisations; and
- (b) To review definitions in section 2 of the Ordinance vis-à-vis offence sections of the Ordinance to ensure that the net was not cast unduly wide.
