I. Election of Chairman

Miss Margaret NG was elected Chairman of the Bills Committee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(3)706/02-03 and CB(2)811/03-04(02) & (03)]

- 2. The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to provide a written response to the following issues raised by members at the above meeting -
 - (a) differences in the role of the Social Welfare Department (SWD) and the non-governmental organisations (NGOs) brought about by changes to the adoption system as proposed in the Bill;
 - (b) administrative arrangements for adoptions involving local children by Mainland and overseas adopters and the role of SWD and NGOs in such adoptions;
 - (c) an account of the most serious shortcomings in the existing private arrangements for adoption by unrelated persons, and the rationale of the proposal to criminalise such arrangements and whether similar legislation was in place in other jurisdictions;
 - (d) any shortfalls in the number of children available for adoption to meet demands in the past few years;
 - (e) the Administration's policy on overseas adoption and the measures in place to facilitate such adoption;

- (f) whether there were cases of adoption overseas which did not require consent of both birth parents in the case of a divorced couple and whether such adoptions were recognised by Hong Kong;
- (g) in case of a divorced mother who had removed her children from Hong Kong and re-married without adoption of the children by her current husband, what legal rights the natural father had if he wanted to claim back the children;
- (h) how SWD followed up cases of children being taken by one of their parents without the other's consent to the Mainland for adoption;
- (i) in case of adoption of a child by his/her relative, whether the objective of "best interests of the children" could be met given the broad definition of "relative" in the Adoption Ordinance;
- (j) details of the procedures (e.g. assessment of the suitability of the adoptive families) for adoption by overseas parents;
- (k) the adoptive parents' responsibility to their adopted children as intended by the Administration, and whether the Court's ruling that Mainland children adopted by Hong Kong residents were not regarded as these residents' children by birth under Article 24 of the Basic Law had created difficulty for adoptive parents in fulfilling their responsibility in this regard; and
- (l) details of the arrangements made for the public consultation on the proposed amendments and the views received.
