Proposed Committee Stage Amendments on Accreditation Principles

Purpose

This paper sets out the rationale for the proposed Committee Stage Amendments to the Adoption (Amendment) Bill in respect of the accreditation principles.

Background

2. At the meeting of the Bills Committee on 7 June 2004, in considering the draft CSAs on the Accreditation Principles (new Schedule 4), Members noted that the accreditation principles set out therein were adapted from Articles 10 and 11 of the Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption (the Hague Convention, relevant extract at Annex A). Members indicated that in relation to Accredited Bodies undertaking local adoption, there might be scope for setting out the accreditation principles in more specific terms.

Local Adoption

3. Following the meeting on 7 June 2004, we have sought the views

of 5 NGOs¹ on a set of accreditation principles (Annex B). Such principles had previously been incorporated in the Consultation Document on NGOs's role in local adoption discussed in April 2004. The NGOs are content with the principles. Their replies are set out in Annex C. On the basis of Articles 10 and 11 of the Hague Convention and the principles set out in Annex B, we have prepared a set of revised CSAs at Annex D.

Revised CSAs

4. Accredited Bodies undertaking intercountry adoption would be accredited by the Director of Social Welfare in accordance with the principles set out in Articles 10 and 11 of the Hague Convention [revised section 26(1)]. For local adoption, the Director may accredit bodies in accordance with the principles set out in Schedule 4 [new section 26(2)).

New Schedule 4

- 5. The accreditation principle in paragraph 1 of Schedule 4 relates to the experience and resources of accredited bodies. This principle reflects Article 10 of the Hague Convention, as well as item 4 and part of item 6 of the principles set out in Annex B and with which the 5 NGOs agreed.
- 6. The accreditation principle in paragraph 2(a) stipulates that the accredited body shall be a charitable institution exempted from tax under s88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance. This reflects Article 11(a) of the Convention, and item 2 of the principles set out in <u>Annex B</u>.

- (a) Mother's Choice and International Social Service Hong Kong Branch which provide services relating to intercountry adoptions and are members of the revamped Working Group on Review of the Adoption Ordinance;
- (b) Caritas Hong Kong which used to provide services relating to intercountry adoption and is a member of the revamped Working Group on Review of the Adoption Ordinance;
- (c) Hong Kong Family Welfare Society which has an interest in adoption matters and is a member of the revamped Working Group on the Review of the Adoption Ordinance; and
- (d) Po Leung Kuk which should have the capacity to provide adoption services as it provides nearly all types of residential services for vulnerable children and women including place of refuge for children, women shelter, small group homes, foster care, residential crèches and nurseries, and so on.

- 7. The accreditation principles in paragraphs 2(b) and (c) refer to the qualifications of the supervisory personnel and those working on the adoption team in the accredited body. This reflects Article 11(b) of the Hague Convention, as well as item 3 and part of item 6 of the principles set out in Annex B.
- 8. Paragraph 2(d) refers to effective internal procedures to supervise the operation of the accredited body. This reflects Article 10 of the Hague Convention (bodies demonstrating their competence to carry out properly the tasks with which they may be entrusted), as well as item 5 and part of item 6 of the principles set out in <u>Annex B</u>.

Conclusion

9. Members may wish to note the contents of this paper in going through the attached set of proposed Committee Stage Amendments.

Health, Welfare and Food Bureau June 2004

Articles 10 and 11 of the Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Cooperation in respect of Intercountry Adoption

Article 10

Accreditation shall only be granted to and maintained by bodies demonstrating their competence to carry out properly the tasks with which they may be entrusted.

Article 11

An accredited body shall -

- a) pursue only non-profit objectives according to such conditions and within such limits as may be established by the competent authorities of the State of accreditation;
- b) be directed and staffed by persons qualified by their ethical standards and by training or experience to work in the field of intercountry adoption; and
- c) be subject to supervision by competent authorities of that State as to its composition, operation and financial situation.

Accreditation Principles for Local Adoption circulated to and agreed with the Five Non-Governmental Organizations

- 1. The agency complies with the law of HKSAR and follows the principles laid down in Article 10 and 11 of the Hague Convention.
- 2. The agency operates as an approved charitable organization registered under section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance (Cap. 112).
- 3. There is a designated section in the agency directed by persons with appropriate qualifications and staffed by social workers who have registered in the Social Workers Registration Board, Hong Kong under the Social Workers Registration Ordinance (Cap. 505) to undertake home assessment and placement tasks for the purpose of adoption.
- 4. The agency has specialized experience in providing adoption or child welfare services.
- 5. There is a mechanism set up by the management of the agency to monitor the adoption work of the agency.
- 6. The agency has a clearly delineated organization structure, resources to make adoption arrangement for children, and a written policy and working procedures governing the work of the agency.

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Detailed Committee Stage Amendments for the Accreditation Principles

31 (a) By adding before the proposed section 26 –

"PART 7

ACCREDITED BODIES, SUITABILITY ASSESSMENT OF PROSPECTIVE ADOPTERS, AND PLACEMENT, ETC.

25. Interpretation of Part 7

- (1) In this Part_and Schedule 4, unless the context otherwise requires –
- "adoption of overseas children" (海外兒童領養) means an adoption within the meaning of paragraph (a) of the definition of "non-Convention adoption";
- "Convention adoption" (公約領養) has the meaning assigned to it by paragraph (a) of the definition of the expression in section 20A(1);
- "local adoption" (本地領養) means the adoption of an infant resident in Hong Kong by a person resident in Hong Kong;
- "non-Convention adoption" (非公約領養) means
 - (a) the adoption of an infant resident in a place outside the People's Republic of China by a person resident in Hong Kong, other than a Convention adoption; or
 - (b) the adoption of an infant resident in Hong
 Kong by a person resident in a place outside
 the People's Republic of China, other than a
 Convention adoption.".

(b) By deleting the proposed sections 26, 27, 28 and 29 and substituting –

"26. Accredited bodies

- (1) The Director may, in accordance with the principles set out in Schedule 4Articles 10 and 11 of the Convention (as defined in section 20A(1)), accredit, or renew the accreditation, of a body of persons (corporate or unincorporate) as an accredited body in relation to
 - (a) Convention adoption; or
 - (b) non-Convention adoption.; or
 - (c) local adoption.
- (2) The Director may, in accordance with the principles set out in Schedule 4, accredit, or renew the accreditation, of a body of persons (corporate or unincorporate) as an accredited body in relation to local adoption.
- (32) An accreditation may be subject to such conditions as the Director may reasonably impose.
- (43) Unless revoked or suspended, an accreditation shall be valid for a period of four years or such lesser period as the Director may determine when he grants or renews the accreditation.
- (54) The Director may, at any time by notice in writing served on the accredited body, amend or revoke any such condition, or impose new conditions, as may be reasonable in the circumstances.
- (6) An accredited body may, while acting under and in accordance with its accreditation and subject to the

provisions of this Ordinance, make arrangements for the adoption of infants and proceed with their placement for adoption.

26A. Revocation or suspension of accreditation

- (5)—The Director may, at any time by notice in writing served on an accredited body, revoke or suspend its accreditation if
 - (a) in his opinion, the accredited body is operated in a manner that is inconsistent with the principles in accordance with which it is accredited under section 26(1) or (2)set out in Schedule 4; or
 - (b) any condition of the accreditation has not been or is not being complied with by the accredited body.

26BA. Register of accredited bodies

- (1) The Director shall cause to be kept, in such form as he may specify, a register of accredited bodies containing—
 - (a) the name and address of every accredited body; and
 - (b) such other particulars as the Director thinks fit.

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32 (a) In the proposed Schedule 3, in Chapter III, by deleting Articles 10 and 11.

(b) By adding –

"SCHEDULE 4 [ss. 25 & 26(2)]

ACCREDITATION PRINCIPLES

- 1. Accreditation shall only be granted to and maintained by a body of persons (corporate or unincorporate) that demonstrates its competence to carry out properly tasks related to local adoption services, having regard to
 - (a) the experience that it has in adoption services or child welfare services; and
 - (b) its financial status and the resources
