Reply:

- (a) In 2002, a total of 108 corruption cases were generated as a result of our proactive approach and a total of 129 persons were prosecuted as a result.
- (b) In 2002-03, ICAC officers made 27 visits to the Mainland involving 11 cases for the purpose of investigation. The total expenditure involved was \$52,702, mainly for the payment of travelling expenses, board and lodging incurred by the officers concerned.
- (c) In 2002-03, no ICAC officer was required to give evidence in Mainland courts.
- (d) & (e) In 2002-03, no Mainland official was invited to Hong Kong by the ICAC for investigation or testifying in court and therefore no expenditure was incurred for the purpose.
