Action

I. Confirmation of the minutes of the 5th meeting held on 8 November 2002 (LC Paper No. CB(2) 326/02-03)

The minutes were confirmed.

# II. Matters arising

Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration (CS)

#### Patents (General) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules 2002

- 2. The Chairman said that she had informed CS that the existence of a relevant pending appeal to the Court of Final Appeal (CFA) was not mentioned in the Legislative Council (LegCo) Brief for the Amendment Rules. She had also pointed out to CS that it was unusual for the Administration to make legislative changes while relevant court proceedings were still in progress.
- 3. The Chairman further said that CS had responded that he did not know the details of the issue, but he understood that there were inconsistencies in the patents legislation which must be addressed. CS had also explained that the pending appeal case was not mentioned in the LegCo Brief because the Administration did not wish to make any comments while it was being handled by the courts. The government officials concerned would explain in detail to the subcommittee which had been set up to study the Amendment Rules.
- 4. <u>Miss Margaret NG</u> said that the Subcommittee on the Patents (General) (Amendment) (No.2) Rules 2002 had held its first meeting on 14 November 2002. <u>Miss NG</u> further said that if the one-month time limit in the existing section 39(1) of the Patents (General) Rules was removed, and if CFA ruled, in the end, in favour of the appellant, by holding that provision in question was *ultra vires*, the situation would be absurd. In her view, the Administration should not have made the Amendment Rules given the pending court case. <u>Miss NG</u> added that the Administration should have informed Members of the court proceedings and the issues concerned in the LegCo Brief for the Amendment Rules.

5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that she had conveyed Members' views to CS. <u>The Chairman</u> further said that the Subcommittee would continue to discuss the Amendment Rules with the Administration, and would provide a report to the House Committee upon completion of its deliberation.

#### III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

# Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 8 November 2002

(LC Paper No. LS 17/02-03)

- 6. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> said that there were three items of subsidiary legislation gazetted on 8 November 2002 and tabled in Council on 13 November 2002.
- 7. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> explained that the Shipping and Port Control (Closure of Waters) (No. 2) Notice 2002 specified that the area of the waters off the Phase II Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre would be closed to certain class of vessels for the period between noon on 18 November 2002 and 3:00 pm on 20 November 2002.
- 8. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> further explained that the Waste Disposal (Designated Waste Disposal Facility) (Amendment) Regulation 2002 (L.N. 118 of 2002) (Commencement) Notice 2002 and Waste Disposal (Refuse Transfer Station) (Amendment) Regulation 2002 (L.N. 119 of 2002) (Commencement) Notice 2002 appointed 12 December 2002 as the day on which the two Amendment Regulations would come into operation.
- 9. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> said that no difficulties relating to the legal and drafting aspects of these three items of subsidiary legislation had been identified.
- 10. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending these items of subsidiary legislation was 11 December 2002, or 8 January 2003 if extended by resolution.
