### Transcription Charges for Notes for Proceedings

The Society's Criminal Law & Procedure Committee has raised query upon the Judiciary on their method of charging for transcribed notes of proceedings following consideration of a complaint from a member firm. The firm has been asked to pay the transcription rather than the copying charges when transcription has already taken place and paid for under a previous request.

The Judiciary justified the charging mechanism by explaining that they have adopted a cost – absorption method in recovering the transcription cost, i.e. the total production cost is spread evenly among an estimated utilization that covers all requests of transcript from different parties. Adopting such method, the current charge is being fixed at HK\$85.00 per page.

The Committee fails to see how the cost could be fixed at HK\$85.00 per page at the outset when the number of pages of the transcribed notes of proceedings and the number of users would vary from case to case. Upon further inquiry, it was also noted with concern that neither the Legal Aid Department nor any of the government departments is charged for their requests for transcribed notes of proceedings.

Copies of the relevant correspondence with the JA are enclosed for your consideration. The Committee believes that this issue warrants further investigation and consideration by the LegCo Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services.

The Law Society has had some correspondence with Messrs. Tsang, Chan & Wong concerning a request for notes of proceedings in cases heard in the Eastern Magistracy. The firm has been asked to pay the transcription charges for the notes of proceedings notwithstanding the fact that the notes had already been transcribed and all that was required was to photocopy the existing transcript.

A letter dated 14th July was received by the firm from your office stating that according to the standing instructions of your accounting procedures the charge of a transcript produced from the digital audio recording system or by court reporters applies to all requests from different parties for the same set of transcribed proceedings. Accordingly any party wishes to obtain a copy of the transcript has to pay the transcription fee although transcription has already taken place and only photocopying is required.

This it seems on the face of it to be somewhat unreasonable and a duplication of fees payable to the Judiciary. I would be most grateful if you would look into the matter and let me know your views so that I may pass these on to the firm of solicitors concerned in due course.

Thank you for your letter dated 7 September 1999.

The level of transcription charge is based on the cost of providing the transcription service. The current charge is \$85 per page which was last revised in 1997. However, the production cost of a transcript was \$119 per page. It consists of two major cost components:-

> (a) Transcription service cost charged by the Digital Audio Recording and Transcription System (DARTS) contractor.

> (b) Cost of Judiciary staff involved in processing/validating the transcript and related administrative overheads.

Costs relating to operation, maintenance and management of the DARTS system from which transcripts are produced are not included in the cost calculation. In fixing the charge at \$85 per page, we have spread out the above production cost over an utilisation which covers all requests of transcript from

I refer to our previous correspondence on the subject ending with your letter dated 15 January 2000.

The Criminal Law & Procedure Committee understands that the fee level for transcript service at \$85 per page is based on an estimated unit cost using the "adoption costing" method i.e. with the total production cost being spread evenly among an estimated utilisation which covers all requests of transcript from different parties. However, it is unclear to the Committee as to whether the requests of the prosecution and the legal Aid Department has been taken into account in calculating the number of users. 

Thank you for your letter of 13 November.

We do not charge Department of Justice, Legal Aid Department or any other government departments. The Director of Legal Aid is entitled to transcripts free of charge under the Legal Aid Ordinance (s.16B, Cap.91). The Secretary for Justice is entitled to have a copy free of charge of the record of proceedings taken in a trial under the Criminal Procedure Ordinance (s.79, All government departments are not charged as there is no Cap.221). apparent need to invoke the inter-departmental charging mechanism.

However, it does not follow that they are being subsidized by other users or your privately funded clients. In our costing exercise, requests from them have also been taken into account to form part of the total estimated number of requests for transcripts. The rate of \$85 was arrived at by dividing the total production costs by this total estimated number.

I hope I have clarified the matter.
