Information of Australia, Canada (Ontario), UK and Hong Kong rating systems is listed below:

Australian Rating System:

Category	Explanation
G (General)	Suitable for all ages
PG (Parental Guidance)	Parental guidance recommended for persons under 15 years
M (Mature)	Recommended for mature audiences 15 years and over
MA (Mature Accompanied)	Restrictions apply to persons under the age of 15 (this category is legally restrictive)
R (Restricted)	Restricted to adults 18 years and over (this category is legally restrictive)
RC (Refused Classification)	Refused classification

Canadian (Ontario) Rating System:

Category	Explanation
F (Family)	Film appropriate for viewing by a person of any age
PG (Parental Guidance Advised)	Parents should exercise discretion in permitting a child to view the film
AA (Adult Accompaniment required under age of 14)	Adult accompaniment required under age of 14
R (Admittance Restricted to persons 18 years of age or older)	Film restricted to persons 18 years of age or older (this category is legally restrictive)

UK Rating System:

Category	Explanation
U (Universal)	A 'U' film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over
PG (Parental Guidance)	A 'PG' film should not disturb a child aged around eight or older
12	No one younger than 12 may see a '12' film in a cinema (this category is legally restrictive)
12A (Accompanied and Advisory)	No one younger than 12 may see a '12A' film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult (this category is legally restrictive)
15	No one younger than 15 may see a '15' film in a cinema (this category is legally restrictive)

18	No one younger than 18 may see a '18' film in a cinema (this category is legally restrictive)

Hong Kong Classification System:

Category	Explanation
Category I	Approved for exhibition to persons of any age
Category IIA	Not suitable for children
Category IIB	Not suitable for young persons and children
Category III	Approved for exhibition only to persons who have attained the age of 18 years (this category is legally restrictive)
