Dear Sir,

Religious people love the Ten Commandments, "You shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not bear false witness against your neighbor, honor your father and mother, you shall not commit adultery, ... " (Cf. Cultural Revolution and the Red Guards educated with "revolutionary ideas, dialectical and historical materialism").

But in China, commandments/laws is not emphasized but "beneficial to the party, beneficial to the people, beneficial to the country" and "Materialism".

Basic Law 23 shall be postponed indefinitely, we have two different systems and totally different mentality, as "Rule of Law", "One Law for all", and "freedom if not break the law" is deep-rooted in Hong Kong, but not in China, where everyone would have to obey the Security Police.
