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Provision of Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) to HA Hospitals

Provision of Personal Protection Equipment (PPE)

During the early stage of the SARS outbreak, first reported in Prince of Wales Hospital (PWH) in early March 2003, the initial demand for PPE was met by established contracts of surgical masks and disposable caps whilst direct purchases of N95/N100 respirators and other additional PPE were made by PWH to meet its urgent requirements without difficulty.

2. In response to the SARS crisis, the following crisis management measures were taken to support the clusters and hospitals on urgent provision of PPE and additional medical equipment required for the treatment and diagnosis of SARS.

(a) Sub-Command Centre

Under the direct supervision of Senior Executive Manager (Business Support Services), a Sub-Command Centre with dedicated e-mail domain and linkage to cluster co-ordinators of supplies and business support functions was set up on 29 March 2003 with urgent assistance by the Information Technology Department.

The communication centre was manned by staff from Business Support Services Department and Electrical & Mechanical Services Department daily from 8:45 am to 5:15 pm for the period 29 March 2003 to 30 May 2003. The centre had responded promptly to all enquiries or requests for supply of PPE and mobilization of transport, rearrangement of laundry and linen services, urgent purchase and commissioning of additional medical equipment for the treatment of SARS patients.

Urgent information regarding supplies, delivery of medical equipment and biomedical engineering support arrangements was disseminated through the Sub-Command Centre on all occasions to the concerned cluster co-ordinators and cohorting hospitals.

Besides daily round up meetings, additional meetings were also held regularly with the cluster co-ordinators to review problems and agree on ad hoc measures such as reallocation of N95 respirators, goggles and 3M Air Mate Systems in anticipation of supply shortage or unexpected delay in deliveries.

Monitoring of the consumption and co-ordination of forecast of weekly/monthly demand of PPE by clusters were also steered through the Sub-Command Centre.

(b) Central Sourcing and Procurement

The entire team of Procurement and Materials Management Section (PMMS) staff (2 Chief Supplies Officers, 1 Senior Supplies Officer, 4 Supplies Officers, 4 Assistant Supplies Officers and 4 Supplies Supervisors I) was deployed to conduct daily sourcing of supplies of PPE and the required additional medical equipment, urgent negotiations with suppliers and placing of numerous orders for secured supplies.

Urgent purchase of medical equipment was also arranged by the procurement staff through the Sub-Command Centre to match the need of the SARS hospitals. The HA's normal procurement procedures were not followed due to the urgency and critical operational requirements for combating the SARS crisis.

High level meetings and negotiations with suppliers of the much sought after PPE items were led by the SEM(BSS) and on several occasions eg supply of N95 respirators, 3M Air Mate and Stryker T4 System participated by the then Deputizing Chief Executive.

Liaison for input or advice from the Infection Control Experts was maintained through the Sub-Command Centre and also augmented by SEM(BSS) on specific issues with other advisors related to the heightened demand for newly added PPE items.

Evaluation of PPE samples was also a daily task at the Sub-Command Centre and the quality of PPE was also checked by supplies staff at the respective clusters/hospitals.

A chronological order of the inception of central bulk purchases and supply initiated by types of PPE and medical equipment during the SARS crisis is listed here below:

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c) Biomedical Engineering Support

The entire Biomedical Engineering Service team (5 engineers and 9 technicians) was deployed to assist the cohorting hospitals in the testing/commissioning of new medical equipment (comprising 183 ventilators, 196 monitors, 844 infusion pumps, 212 pulse oximeters, and 30 mobile X-ray units), and performing wellness check of equipment redeployed for use in the management of SARS.

Additional on-site support by biomedical engineering staff of the Electrical and Mechanical Services Trading Fund was also pre-arranged through the Sub-Command Centre, in response to the changes in increased demand for operational support from all the concerned hospitals.

Adequacy of Supply of PPE

- 3. Prior to the SARS crisis, most of the PPE except surgical masks were not commonly purchased for use by the HA's hospitals. As the SARS outbreak heightened in late March, the sourcing and procurement of all PPE, such as N95 respirators, surgical masks, disposable gowns, goggles and face shields were very much affected by the beginning of the global surge in demand for supply of PPE items. During the months of March and April, problems were experienced in building up an estimated stock of 1-2 months of PPE and in maintaining a steady bulk supply of all the PPE items in spite of rigorous sourcing and enquiries, both local and overseas, conducted by the staff of PMMS. Contacts were also made with the various consulates with a view to widen the sourcing network for PPE, particularly in respect of N95 respirators and goggles, for which the production in different countries was known to be very much behind the hugely increased demand.
- During the peak phase of the SARS crisis, PPE standards and requirements were constantly upgraded with input from the cluster management and infection control experts. The staff's demand on the level of protection also rose dramatically due to increase in personal fear and the higher level of protection advocated by some units/hospitals in combating SARS.

A snap-shot comparison of the peak consumption of various PPE and the total average stock available in the affected HA's hospitals at various critical periods is shown below to illustrate the situation of stock and consumption during the SARS crisis. A breakdown of the average consumption and stock level of the various PPE by clusters for the period 17 March 2003 to 31 May 2003 are shown at Appendix I (a)—(i).

It was difficult to project during early April the actual consumption of PPE due to the uncertainty of SARS workload.

- Reallocation of stock between clusters to meet increase in demand against supply shortage was co-ordinated by the Sub-Command Centre whenever there was a need advised by the clusters. Bulk distribution and allocation to clusters were co-ordinated by the PMMS with reference to the daily feedback and/or regular report on projected consumption estimates from the hospitals/clusters at different stages of the SARS crisis. Details of the supply distribution and corresponding consumption of the various PPE by clusters for the period 17 March 2003 to 31 May 2003 are shown at Appendix II (a)—(i).
- During the SARS crisis, donated supply of N95 respirators, disposable gowns and other PPE from different sources, including a large donated supply from the Central Government, China were received. These donated supplies were immediately distributed, upon receipt by the Hospital Authority Head Office, to augment the stock of PPE held in the hospital/clusters.
- 8. Throughout the SARS crisis, the supply of N95 small size respirators that would fit the majority of female staff had always been an area of on-going concern. To counteract the feared shortage against staff's increased demand, alternative models of N95 respirators were also sourced and tested with the assistance of an expert in the Prince of Wales Hospital. A self-explanatory summary of the range of various models of N95 respirators tested and the approved models subsequently sourced to increase the bulk distribution is shown at Appendix III.

Adequacy of Distribution Processes

- 9. Staff complaints regarding both the standards and adequacy of supply to the frontline arose throughout the SARS crisis, many of which were publicized through the media, and became a daily feature of criticism during the early phases.
- 10. Retrospective review of the statistics captured on consumption and stock (relevant details shown in Appendix I (a)–(i)) did not reveal significant supply problems except some near stock-out situations occurred (ie less than two days' stock on hand) during some critical periods.

- 11. Following the formation of the Working Group on Supplies and Environmental Control on 29 April 2003, the following areas concerning PPE were reviewed:
 - (a) Efficiency and adequacy of the PPE supplies;
 - (b) Effectiveness of PPE supplies logistics.

It was observed that the central procurement support and allocation of bulk supplies had facilitated better forecasts of changes in demand/consumption of PPE, resulting generally in stabilized bulk supply arrangements and consistent stock levels (a minimum of one week's stock) held in clusters during the peak phase of the SARS crisis).

- 12. Feedback obtained from hospital visits and meetings with the middle managers of the cohorting hospitals, particularly the Ward Managers, showed that communication on standards of PPE and local supply/distribution arrangements would require strengthening. Staff's understanding of appropriate compliance with the set standards of PPE also varied due to personal fear and the higher level of protection advocated at the frontline in some hospitals.
- Results of an endusers' survey conducted in mid May 2003 showed that most of the required PPE items was generally sufficient except for the supply of N95 small size respirators. Initial collation of the feedback from nurses showed that 90% of the respondents was fully satisfied with the supply and provision of PPE at their working places. Other comments are being collated. Samples of the questionnaires are attached at Appendix IV.

Facilities Management

14. The team under the supervision of Deputy Director (Professional Services & Facilities Management) mainly dealt with the environmental related issues within existing hospital settings. The main focus was to assist hospitals to assess and improve their hospital ventilation systems.

a) Ventilation Modifications

With the support given by the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD), HA had carried out survey to re-confirm the ventilation level of the various hospitals.

According to the World Health Organization guideline on housing SARS patients within negative pressure rooms, Arrangements had been made with EMSD to install in the cohorting hospitals additional exhaust fans in wards assigned for handling SARS patients. The purpose of the provision of additional exhaust fans was to create negative pressure

within the cohorting wards where the air would only be flowing in one direction and the air change rates would be increased, hence creating a better air dilution effect.

As of 9 June.2003, ventilation modification had been made to 226 numbers of wards in 24 hospitals including PYNEH, RHTSK, TWEH, QMH, FYKH, QEH, BH, KH, TKO, UCH, PMH, CMC, KCH, KWH, WTS, OLMH YCH, AHNH, NDH, PWH, SH, TPH, SCH and TMH. The peak period was encountered in early April where more than 40 numbers of wards were modified in the same period. There were 13 operating theatres converted into negative pressure setting in 8 hospitals, namely, PYNEH, UCH, PMH, QMH, KWH, YCH, PWH and TMH. Details were given at Appendix V.

Under the direction given by the in-house HA Task Force on Supplies and Environmental Control, the team had also examined the availability of isolation facilities in HA hospitals and assessed the feasibility of converting existing single rooms in hospitals into negative pressure facilities.

With the specialized technical support and recommendation given by the Environment, Transport and Works Bureau (ETWB), the team had assisted in formulating the short term, medium term and long term improvement measures for HA to prepare for the resurgence of the SARS disease or the outbreak of other infectious diseases. Implementation of the various improvement measures was being coordinated via the HA Task Force on Supplies and Environmental Control. ETWB departments comprising Architectural Services Department, Environmental Protection Department and Electrical and Mechanical Services Department worked together with HA in the detailed design and implementation of the measures.

b) Hospital Planning

To meet the demand for ICU facilities at PMH, sketch layout for the conversion of wards into ICU in the hospital was drawn up. A review on ward space provisions and the effective hospital bed capacity was completed. Outcome of the review was presented to the Task Force of HA Board on 16 May 2003. Another review on the possible conversion of existing facilities into one with more isolation rooms was also conducted. Conversion proposals comprising 9 acute hospitals had been prepared for funding application to Government.

c) Equipment Assessment

The use of ozone disinfection was discussed by experts in the Advisory Group on Facilities, Equipment and PPE on 29 April 2003. Two ozone-generating machines were sent to QMH on 6 June.2003 and were being tested for disinfection of goggles and face shields. Test result was pending.
