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**WRITTEN STATEMENT OF YANG SIU FAN**

1. On 22 February 2003, I was on duty between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. as a Triage Nurse. The patient [REDACTED] came to see me at the Triage Station. He was accompanied by relatives (at least 2 female relatives).
2. He said he had palpitation and dyspnoea for 4 days. He had no major illnesses before. The patient was alert.
3. His blood pressure was 116/55 mmHg. Temperature was 38.5 °C. Pulse was 117min.
4. The patient had had pneumonia in February but had recovered.
5. There was mild shortness of breath (SOB). The SaO<sub>2</sub> shown on the bedside oximetry was only 65% which was a very low figure. Respiratory rate was 26 per minute.
6. In view of the very low SaO<sub>2</sub> level, the patient was immediately transferred to the Resuscitation Room in the AED.
7. Prior to seeing [REDACTED], I had not received any information about him. My perception about this patient was that he was just an ordinary old man.
