4. <u>Members</u> agreed that clauses 2, 5, 6 and 7 of the Bill relating to the gross vehicle weight of light buses should come into operation on 1 August 2004. A Committee Stage amendment to this effect would be moved by the Administration.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration subsequently proposed that the whole Bill should come into operation on 1 August 2004. Members noted and agreed.)

5. <u>Members</u> supported the Bill and agreed to report to the House Committee on 11 June 2004, recommending the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill at the Council meeting on 30 June 2004. <u>Members</u> noted that the deadline for giving notice of Committee Stage amendments would be 19 June 2004.
