## Bills Committee on Clearing and Settlement Systems Bill

## **Proposed Discussion Schedule**

The attached table sets out a proposed discussion schedule to take forward the Clearing and Settlement Systems Bill. Given the length and technical complexity of the Bill, and the target to enact the Bill in this legislative session, the Bills Committee may wish to convene meetings on a weekly basis with each meeting lasting for approximately two hours. Members may also wish to reserve additional meeting slots from mid-May 2004 onwards in case of need. The schedule will, of course, be subject to review from time to time in the light of progress made by the Bills Committee.

2. The discussion schedule puts forward a structure for examining the various issues relating to the Bill. The Bills Committee may wish to address first the key policy issues and general principles in two meetings, and proceed on to clause by clause examination thereafter.

3. Since the passage of this Bill in this legislative session is important for Hong Kong's financial and monetary stability as well as our standing as an international financial centre, the Administration appeals to Members for supporting the proposed discussion schedule. Subject to Members' advice, we are prepared to provide relevant background materials to facilitate Members' deliberations.
