I. Meeting with the Administration

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration -
 - (a) to specify in the Bill that no fee or charge would be payable for any application made under the proposed section 67C(1) or (1A) of the Criminal Procedure Ordinance (CPO); and
 - (b) to add a provision to require the Registrar to provide the documents referred to in the proposed section 67D(3) of CPO to the prescribed prisoner where the application was made by the prisoner.
- 3. Regarding the Administration's response in relation to the proposed section 67F(2) of CPO, members disagreed with the Administration's view that "If the judge decides, after the proper exercise of his discretion, to impose a determinate sentence despite the existence of a conditional release order, the amendment as suggested by Members would amount to a direct interference in the sentencing process contrary to the interests of the public. In effect, the legislature would be granting the prisoner a remission of sentence in advance despite the fact that the judge considered that, in all the circumstances, the length of sentence should extend into or beyond the duration of

the conditional release order". Nevertheless, members in general accepted that there were sufficient safeguards to protect the interest of prescribed prisoners, and agreed to the retention of the proposed section 67F(2).

- 4. The Chairman concluded that, subject to the revised Committee Stage amendments to be provided by the Administration, the Bills Committee supported the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill at the Council meeting on 7 July 2004.
- 5. The Bills Committee noted that a written report would be made to the House Committee on 18 June 2004. It also noted that the deadline for the Administration to issue consultation letter to the Chairman of the House Committee would be 15 June 2004, the deadline for giving notice of resumption of Second Reading debate would be 19 June 2004 and the deadline for giving notice of moving Committee Stage amendments would be 26 June 2004.
- 6. The meeting ended at 3:55 pm.
