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I Election of Chairman

<u>Ir Dr Raymond HO</u>, the member who had the highest precedence among members of the Subcommittee, presided over the election of Chairman. Ms Miriam LAU was nominated by <u>Mr LAU Kong-wah</u> and the nomination was seconded by <u>Ir Dr Raymond HO</u>. <u>Ms LAU</u> accepted the nomination. There being no other nominations, <u>Ms Miriam LAU</u> was elected Chairman of the Subcommittee. Ms LAU then took over the chair.

- 2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex A**).
- 3. The Subcommittee noted the following papers tabled at the meeting:
 - (a) Letter dated 28 June 2004 from Mr LEUNG Fu-wah who was unable to attend the meeting;
 - (b) Submission dated 28 June 2004 from Universal Cars Limited;
 - (c) Submission dated 28 June 2004 from Zung Fu Company Limited; and
 - (d) Submission dated 28 June 2004 from Yardway Motors Ltd.

(*Post-meeting note*: The above papers were subsequently issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)2281/03-04.)

- 4. The Subcommittee received views from the attending deputations of the public light bus (PLB) trade and vehicle suppliers of PLB, and deliberated on the problem as raised by the PLB trade that the proposed commencement of the four items of subsidiary legislation in relation to the installation of passenger protection equipment on all new PLBs registered on or after 1 August 2004 might disrupt their plans to replace diesel PLBs with liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) PLBs. The PLB trade was concerned that as indicated by one of the major vehicle suppliers of LPG PLBs, new short wheel base vehicles would not be available in the market until November 2004 due to changes in the manufacturing process to cope with the installation of passenger protection equipment on new PLBs. As a result of the shortage of supply of short wheel base LPG PLBs, owners of diesel PLBs would be deprived of the right to obtain the one-off grant of \$60,000 as provided for under the incentive scheme to encourage diesel PLB owners to replace their vehicles with ones that were run on LPG.
- 5. <u>The Subcommittee</u> noted the Administration's explanation that a period of 20 months was already allowed for vehicle manufacturers to prepare for the new requirements. While it would not be appropriate to amend the legislative timetable simply because one supplier was unable to supply one of the PLB models in time, the

Administration was prepared to make special arrangements to address the problem encountered by the PLB trade so that a PLB owner whose diesel PLB was reaching the age of ten years or above by end-2004, and who had placed a purchase order for an LPG PLB on or before 1 August 2004, might be eligible for the grant for an extended period.

6. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated on the Administration's proposal. Taking into account the views of the PLB trade, <u>members</u> considered that it would be more appropriate to adopt 31 December 2004 as the deadline for PLB owners to place purchase orders for replacement LPG PLBs. <u>The Administration</u> agreed to consider the suggestion and would revert to the Subcommittee. The Administration was requested to provide in writing the details of its proposal to members for information after the meeting.

- 7. <u>The Subcommittee</u> noted that the PLB trade in principle accepted the Administration's proposal if the deadline for placing purchase orders for replacement LPG PLBs was extended to 31 December 2004. In this connection, <u>the Subcommittee</u> also urged the Administration to liaise with the PLB trade on the details of implementation as soon as possible.
- 8. <u>The Subcommittee</u> completed deliberation on the four items of subsidiary legislation, and accepted that the new safety requirements should come into effect on 1 August 2004 to enhance the safety of PLB passengers. <u>The Subcommittee</u> would report to the House Committee on 2 July 2004.
