Action

I. Meeting with Administration

[LC Paper No. CB(2)2858/03-04(01) and (02)]

<u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Administration</u> briefed members on its response to issues raised at the last meeting on 14 June 2004, its proposed way forward and the draft resolution to effect the suggested amendments to the Amendment Regulation [LC Paper No. CB(2)2858/03-04(01)].

(*Post-meeting note*: LC Paper No. CB(2)2858/03-04(01) was tabled at the meeting and issued to members on 18 June 2004.)

Defence clause

- 3. <u>The Administration</u> briefed members on the proposed defence clause in the legislation. <u>The Administration</u> explained that it was not acceptable from the legal policy point of view to apply the new labelling requirements on the basis of source countries. <u>The Administration</u> also considered that a blanket disclaimer did not appear to serve the purpose of discharging liability of the defendant.
- 4. As regards the proposed defence clause to be added to Regulation 5 of the Food and Drugs (Composition and Labelling) Regulation (Cap. 132 sub. leg. W), the Administration advised that it would be for the court to decide whether the defendant had reasonably and in good faith relied on information provided by the importer or manufacturer as to whether the pre-packaged food contained any allergenic substance. Each case would be considered on its own merit.

- 5. The Administration had also explained that a defendant might be considered to have reasonably and in good faith relied on information provided by the importer or manufacturer, if he had relied on the information provided by the importer or manufacturer and declared on the label that the food might contain the specific category or categories of substance(s) as required by the Administration Regulation.
- 6. Mrs Selina CHOW considered that the proposed defence clause could not adequately address the trade's concern about situations where no information could be obtained from the supplier or manufacturer. Some members shared the view that the Administration should clearly advise members of the trade how to comply with the new labelling requirements, and to revise the defence clause to expressly provide for cases where information on allergens could not be obtained.
- 7. The Administration was of the view that manufacturers should not have much difficulty in providing the lists of ingredients which included allergenic substances used in the production process, except the presence of traces caused by cross-contamination or accidental mixing. Nevertheless, the Administration agreed to consider members' views and revert to the Subcommittee at the next meeting to be held on 21 June 2004.
- ALA Members also requested the Assistant Legal Adviser to prepare the following draft amendments for members' consideration at the next meeting –
 - (a) providing for a disclaimer/defence clause in case of unavailability of information on allergens; and
 - amending the commencement date of the Amendment Regulation to a (b) date to be appointed by the Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food by notice published in the Gazette.

Alcoholic drinks

Members agreed to the proposed amendments to continue the exemption for drinks with an alcoholic strength by volume of 10% or more from all labelling Members noted that drinks with an alcoholic strength by volume of requirements. more than 1.2% and less than 10% would be exempted from all labelling requirements except that on durability. The Administration would prepare a voluntary code of practice on the labelling of alcoholic drinks in the latter category in consultation with This voluntary code of practice would be reviewed after one year of implementation.

Grace period

10. On the Administration's proposed extension of the grace period to 30 months, Mrs Selina CHOW said that she would consult the relevant trades on whether the extension could address their concern that some pre-packaged food, such as canned

food, would have a longer durability.

II. Any other business

- 11. <u>The Subcommittee</u> agreed to hold the next meeting on Monday, 21 June 2004 at 8:30 am to continue discussion with the Administration, and to examine the proposed amendments to the Amendment Regulation.
- 12. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Subcommittee would provide a report for the House Committee meeting on 25 June 2004, and the deadline for notice of amendments to the Amendment Regulation was Tuesday, 29 June 2004.
- 13. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 12:00 noon.
