## Statement on the Professional Indemnity Scheme by the Law Society of Hong Kong

In order to assist the deliberations of the LegCo Panel this afternoon I set out below some of the salient features of the report by Willis China (Hong Kong) Limited ("the Willis Report").

The Willis Report reviews current insurance arrangements and reports on what insurance arrangements are in the best interests of the legal profession and of the public.

A number of proposals have been put forward including the following:-

- the existing limit of indemnity of HK\$10 million should be retained
- the insured firm should continue to be responsible for a deductible, namely a determined amount in respect of any claim
- the Solicitors' Indemnity Fund to be responsible for the next HK\$1.5M to HK\$2M
- the balance up to HK\$10M to be covered by a policy taken out with commercial insurers
- there should be risk banding in determining the contributions to be paid by members on the principle that high risk work should account for a greater amount of contributions
