I. Confirmation of minutes

[LC Paper No. CB(2)952/05-06]

The minutes of the meeting held on 4 January 2006 were confirmed.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2617/04-05(01) to (06), CB(2)222/05-06(01) to (03), CB(2)342/05-06(01), CB(2)833/05-06(01) and CB(2)954/05-06(01)]

- 2. The Bills Committee deliberated the following papers
 - (a) the Administration's responses to questions raised by Hon WONG Kwok-hing in his letter dated 22 July 2005 [LC Paper No. CB(2)2617/04-05(01)] regarding termination of the appointment of the building manager under the deed of mutual covenant (DMC) and personal liabilities of members of a management committee (MC) in respect of a decision made by an owners' corporation (OC); and
 - (b) the Administration's responses to matters arising from the meeting on 23 June 2005 [LC Paper No. CB(2)2617/04-05(02)]; and
 - (c) paragraphs 1 to 8 of the Administration's responses to matters arising from the meeting on 12 July 2005 regarding appointment of proxy [LC Paper No. CB(2)2617/04-05(03)]

Avoidance of formation of more than one OC in a building

3. The Administration informed members that it was discussing with the Department of Justice and the Land Registrar as to whether it was feasible to add a provision to the Building Management Ordinance (BMO) stating that one OC should be formed for one DMC. While the Administration did not object in principle to the inclusion of such a provision, it had to consider the implication on those old buildings which were covered by more than one DMC and had formed more than one OC. The Administration would provide further information once details had been worked out.

Owners' right to incorporation

4. <u>Members</u> noted that the Administration would discuss with the Hong Kong Association of Property Management Company Limited with a view to issuing a code of practice to tackle the problem that some property management companies had forbidden owners from distributing leaflets to convene an owners' meeting for the appointment of a new MC. <u>The Chairman</u> suggested that apart from administrative measures, the Administration should consider imposing a statutory obligation on a building manager that he had to allow communication among owners on matters relating to the management of their building such as by distribution of leaflets to letterboxes. In this way, an OC could not pass a resolution to require the building manager not to allow owners to undertake such activities or, otherwise, it would breach the statutory obligation of the building manager.

Adjournment of owners' meeting

- 5. On the Administration's new proposal of applying the requirement of issuance of notice at least 14 days before the meeting to all adjourned meetings, Ms Miriam LAU considered that serving of at least seven days' notice of an adjourned meeting was sufficient. She, however, agreed that by applying the same requirement in respect of length of notice to be served, the Administration's proposal had the merit that it could facilitate the holding of an adjourned meeting immediately before another owners' meeting arranged afresh for discussion of new agenda items.
- 6. <u>Members</u> expressed strong reservations about the Administration's new proposal of amending Form 1 and Form 2 of Schedule 1A in the Bill to the effect that the original proxy instruments could not be used at adjourned meetings. They considered that this would create much nuisance to owners concerned. <u>Ms Miriam LAU</u> suggested that consideration should be given to specifying in the proposed proxy instruments that proxies deposited prior to the original meeting would remain valid unless new proxies from the same owners

had been received. <u>Ms Audrey EU</u> expressed support for Ms LAU's suggestion. The Administration was requested to consider the suggestion.

- 7. Mr LI Kwok-ying asked about the legal status of an MC when a majority of its members had resigned and the number of its remaining members was not sufficient to form a quorum for holding a meeting. Members noted that owners could make an application to the Lands Tribunal for the appointment of an administrator so that an owners' meeting could be convened for the appointment of a new MC. The Administration was requested to provide a paper elaborating on
 - (a) the legal status of the MC under the circumstances as described by Mr LI Kwok-ying and the mechanism for the appointment of a new MC for replacement;
 - (b) in what capacity individual owners could make an application to the Lands Tribunal for the appointment of a new MC and how the costs incurred should be covered; and
 - (c) whether a mechanism for the appointment of co-opted members of an MC was provided under BMO.
